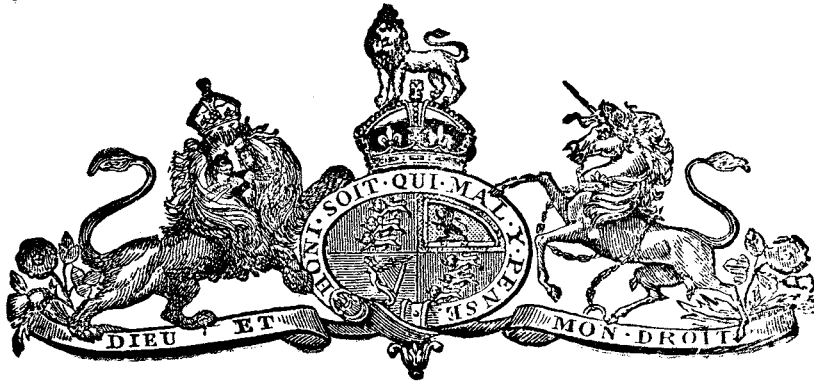

AN ACT to amend the Kingborough Light-^{A.D.} 1929.
 ing Act, 1923. [25 July, 1929.]

WHEREAS the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of Kingborough have, at the request of a two-thirds majority of the electors within a proposed additional light area, named the Gordon Light Area, by special resolution declared that such additional light area should be included in and form part of the light districts of the Municipality of Kingborough : PREAMBLE

And whereas a poll of the electors in the said Gordon Light Area was formally taken on the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, to decide whether or not the Council

Kingborough Lighting.

- A.D. 1929. — should take the necessary steps to borrow the sum of Three thousand eight hundred and eighty Pounds to extend the lighting facilities throughout the said area, and the question was decided in the affirmative
- And whereas the Warden, councillors, and electors of the Municipality of Kingborough are desirous of obtaining a loan of Three thousand four hundred Pounds for the purposes of the Kingborough Lighting Act, 1923 :
- Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—
- Short title. **1** This Act may be cited as “The Kingborough Lighting Act, 1929.”
- Principal Act. **2** The Kingborough Lighting Act, 1923, is hereinafter referred to “as the Principal Act.”
- Power to borrow £3,400. **3** Upon passing a special resolution for that purpose in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1906, it shall be lawful for the Council on behalf of the Corporation to borrow under the provisions of the State Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1921, any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of Three thousand four hundred Pounds for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses of, and incidental to, extending the lighting facilities, and of carrying out all or any of the works and objects of the Principal Act throughout the Gordon Light Area, such sum to be in addition to any moneys borrowed under the authority of the Principal Act, or the Kingborough Lighting Act, 1924.
- Sinking fund. **4** The amount payable by the Council as an annual contribution towards a sinking fund in respect of any moneys borrowed under this Act shall be an amount equal to Two Pounds per centum of the moneys so borrowed.
- Treasurer authorised to raise £3,400. **5** It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to borrow, raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Three thousand four hundred Pounds for the purposes of this Act.
- Act to be read together. **6** This Act and the Principal Act and the Kingborough Lighting Act, 1924, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
