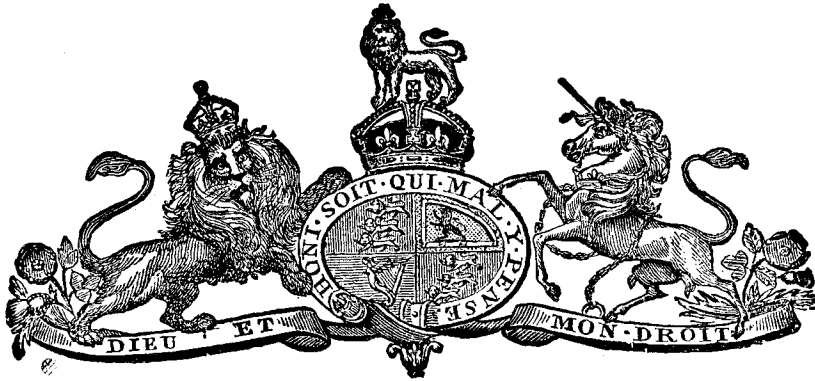

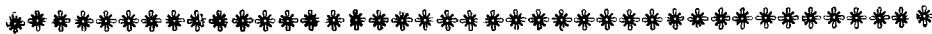

AN ACT to amend "The Lotteries Act, 1878." [13 March, 1924.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Lotteries Act, 1924."

2 Section Three of "The Lotteries Amendment Act, 1899," is hereby amended by inserting therein, after Subsection (3), the following new Subsection (4) :—

"(4)—(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (2) hereof, it shall be lawful for any such committee, as aforesaid, to use at a race-meeting a separate totalisator paying One dividend only on each race (herein called a "straight-out totalisator"), independently of any totalisator paying more than One dividend on each race (herein called a "place totalisator").

(b) All investments received at the several machines, inside and outside, used for such straight-out totalisator, shall be pooled and dealt with as if all such machines constituted One totalisator, but shall be kept separate from the moneys received at the place totalisator, notwithstanding that in any particular race One dividend only may be paid by such place totalisator on account of the number of horses starting in such race.
