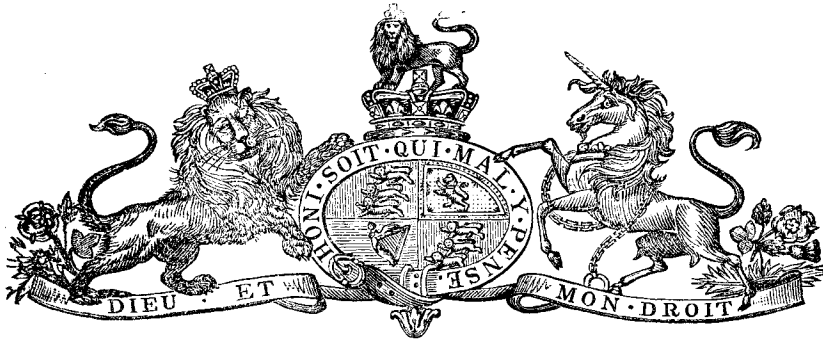

AN ACT to further amend "The Lotteries A.D. 1894.
Act, 1878."

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Lotteries Amendment Act, Short title. 1894."

2 The use of the instrument or device known as the Totalisator, or any other instrument, machine, or contrivance of a like nature, or any device for the distribution of money in a like manner to that effected by the Totalisator, is hereby declared to be illegal, except when used by the direction and with the permission of any duly recognised racing club, or the committee of management of any regatta, upon any racecourse while used by any such Club for the purpose of racing, or upon any regatta-ground, or at the annual meeting of the United Australasian Axemen's Association.

Use of Totalisator

Provided, that no such Club, Committee, or Association shall charge or permit to be charged more than Ten Pounds for every One hundred Pounds of any moneys placed in the Totalisator.

Lotteries Amendment.

Penalty for using
Totalisator con-
trary to this Act.

3 Any person using or permitting to be used, or aiding or abetting in the use, of any Totalisator or any other instrument, machine, or contrivance of a like nature, or any device for the distribution of money in a like manner to that effected by the Totalisator, contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Six months.

Offences against
Act to be heard
and determined

4 All offences against the provisions of this Act shall be heard and determined in a summary manner before any Two Justices of the Peace in the mode prescribed by *The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act*; and any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any summary conviction may appeal against the same in the mode prescribed by *The Appeals Regulation Act*.
