AN ACT to further amend *The Licensing Act*. A.D. 1887.
[20 December, 1887.] —

WHEREAS it is expedient to further amend *The Licensing Act*: **PREAMBLE.**
Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*,
by and with the advice of the Legislative Council and House of
Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 Whenever Justices shall, in execution of the provisions of the Thirty-second Section of "The Licensing Amendment Act, No. 6," have prohibited the sale of Liquor to any such person as therein provided, a copy of such notice of prohibition shall be served on such person; and if such person, after service of such notice as aforesaid, shall during such prohibition purchase or procure, or attempt to purchase or procure, any such Liquor for his own use, he shall in any and every such case forfeit upon conviction a sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings. **If drunkard obtain liquor, liable to penalty.**

2 Whenever Justices shall, in execution of the provisions of "The Licensing Amendment Act, No. 6," have prohibited the sale of Liquor to any such person as therein provided, it shall be lawful for any Two Justices, one of whom shall be a member of a Licensing Bench in Petty Sessions assembled, upon the application of such person by writing under their hands in the form in the Schedule, to cancel such prohibition before the expiration thereof if such person has, in their opinion, reformed at the time of such application, and thereupon such prohibition shall cease to be of any force or effect. **Justices may cancel prohibition.**
