

AN ACT to amend "The Launceston Building A.D. 1895. [24 October, 1895.] Act, 1894."

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Launceston Building PREAMBLE. Act, 1894," in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Launceston Building Act, 1895." Short title.
- 2 In this Act, the expression "the said Act" shall mean "The Interpretation. Launceston Building Act, 1894.'
- 3 Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Act, such buildings as are particularly described in Section Six of the said Act be nearer than and are beyond the line set forth in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall not be exempt from the provisions of the First part of the said Act, unless such buildings and every part of them are Five feet or more from the boundary and are not nearer than Ten feet to the nearest part of any adjoining buildings, whether belonging to the same owner or not to the same owner or not.

4 At any time after the erection of any building or buildings Buildings to be exempted from the provisions of the First part of the said Act as enclosed with a described in Section Six of the said Act, the sale of any sportion of stone or brick wall.

the land upon which the building or buildings are erected which will leave the building or buildings within the distance of Five feet from the boundary as set forth in the preceding paragraph shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the said Act unless such building or buildings are enclosed with a stone, brick, or concrete wall as set forth in Section Six of the said Act.

Correction.

5 The word "Five" is hereby substituted for the word "Four" in the thirty-fifth and thirty-seventh lines of Section Six of the said Act, and the word "the" is hereby substituted for the word "a" in the sixtieth line of Section Six of the said Act.

By-laws.

6 The Council may from time to time make and amend, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, By-laws for regulating the situation and construction of smoke-houses for curing articles of food and the material to be used therein.

Acts to be read together.

7 This Act and the said Act shall be read and construed together as one Act.
