

AN ACT to amend "The Legal Practitioners A.D. 1890. Act, 1888." [28 November, 1890.]

W HEREAS it is desirable to amend "The Legal Practitioners PREAMBLE. 52 Vict. No. 35.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 This Act may be cited as "The Legal Practitioners Act, 1890." Short title.

2 In this Act the expression "the said Act" shall mean "The Interpretation. Legal Practitioners Act, 1888." 52 Vict. No. 35.

3 Every person of the age of Twenty-one years or upwards who Eligibility of has passed the Senior Public Examination prescribed by the Council of certain persons for "The University of Tasmania," and who has been bound by contract admission as Practitioners. in writing to serve for Four years to a Practitioner carrying on business as a Practitioner in the Supreme Court of Tysmania, and has duly served under such contract for and during the said term of Four years after having passed the said Examination shall, after the expiration of such term, upon passing the examination in Law prescribed, and complying with the provisions of the said Act, be entitled to be admitted as a Practitioner of the said Court.

## Legal Practitioners.

Such persons to produce Certificate of examination in Latin, &c. 4 Every person who has passed the said Senior Public Examination, and who is a Candidate for admission as a Practitioner under the said Act, shall produce to the Examiners under the said Act a Certificate from the Registrar to the said University that he has passed an examination in Latin, Arithmetic, Algebra, and Euclid to the satisfaction of the Examiners at such Senior Rublic Examination; and failing the production of such Certificate such Candidate shall be examined in General Literature as well as in Law.

Acts to be read together.

5 This Act and the said Act, save as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.
