

AN ACT to make more effectual Provision for Paving the Streets and other Public Places in the Town of Launceston.

[22 October, 1869.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 Whenever the Municipal Council of the Town of Launceston Half the expense cause the footways or any part thereof of any Street or any public of paving the place within the said Town to be made, formed, and paved with such footways to be material as the Council shall, from time to time, think fit, One half of lands abutting the expense incurred thereby shall be repaid to such Municipal Council thereon. by the owners of the lands abutting on such Street or public place or portion thereof so made, formed, and paved; and if such owner refuses or neglects to pay the same within One month after the same has been demanded, the same shall be recovered in the same way as any Municipal Rate is now recoverable by Law; and such footway shall afterwards be repaired and kept in repair by the said Municipal Council.

2 In the construction of this Act the word "Owner" shall have the Construction meaning assigned to such word in the Fourth Section of The Police of the word "Owner." Act, 1865.

Launceston Paving Act.

Acts to be read together.

3 This Act, and The Launceston Corporation Act, and The Police Act, 1865, so far as the last-mentioned Act applies to the Town of Launceston, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

Short Title.

4 In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression "The Launceston Paving Act."
