

AN ACT to extend the provisions of "The A.D. 1895.

Launceston Police Provident Fund Act." [24 October, 1895.]

WHEREAS it is desirable and expedient to make better provision PREAMBLE. for facilitating the investment upon mortgage of freehold property of the Launceston Police Provident Fund and of all accumulations thereof, and other matters connected therewith:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Launceston Police Provident Fund Short title. Act, 1895."
- 2 In this Act "the said Act" means "The Launceston Police Interpretation. Provident Fund Act."
- 3 The whole or any part or parts of the said Fund and any accumu- Provision for lations thereof may from time to time be invested upon mortgage of investing Fund and accumulation accumulation and accumulation and accumulation accu freehold property in Tasmania, and the sums to be so invested shall be and accumulations on mortgages of repayable at such time or times, in such manner, and with such rate or freehold property. rates of interest and other payments added thereto as may from time to time be provided by any rules or regulations made by the Municipal Council under the provisions of the said Act.

- 4 All such mortgages shall be to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of *Launceston*, hereinafter referred to as the Corporation.
- 5 When all moneys intended to be secured by any mortgage or further charge given to the Corporation have been repaid, they the Corporation may endorse upon or annex to such mortgage or further charge a receipt under the seal of the Corporation, countersigned by the Mayor and Town Clerk, in a specified form made under the rules and regulations of the said Act, and such receipt shall vacate the mortgage or further charge or debt, and vest the estate of and in the property therein comprised in the person for the time being entitled to the equity of redemption without any re-conveyance or re-surrender whatever. If the mortgage or further charge shall have been registered in the Office of the Registrar of Deeds no such receipt shall be sufficient to vacate such mortgage, or to vest the estate of and in the property comprised therein, unless such receipt be also registered in the Office of the Registrar of Deeds as by Law required; and if any such mortgage or further charge shall have been registered in the Office of the Recorder of Titles no such receipt shall be sufficient to vacate such mortgage or further charge unless such receipt be also registered in the Office of the Recorder of Titles.

Acts to be read together.

6 This Act and the said Act and "The Launceston Police Provident Fund Act, 1890," shall be read and construed together as one Act.
