AN ACT to enable the Municipal Council of A.D. 1884. the Town of Launceston to borrow any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding £25,000 for the purpose of improving and extending the Sewerage of the Town.

[24 November, 1884.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Town of Council em-Launceston to borrow on security of the Municipal Rates, other than the powered to borrow Police or Water Rates, any sum or sums of money not exceeding £25,000.

Twenty-five thousand Pounds for the purpose of improving and extending the Sewerage of the said Town.

2 If after having borrowed the said sum or sums, or any part thereof, Council emthe said Council pays off the same, it shall be lawful for the said Council powered to pay off and so from time to time off and re-borrow. again to borrow the amount so paid off, and so from time to time.

3 The sum or sums of money hereinbefore mentioned shall be in Loan to be in addition to any money borrowed by the said Municipal Council under addition to former the Acts of Parliament of the 23rd Victoria, No. 6, the 31st Victoria, loans. No. 41, the 39th Victoria, No. 13, and the 44th Victoria, No. 11, and the provisions of The Launceston Corporation Act relating to 22 Vict. No. 12. Mortgages of Rates shall be applicable to any sum or sums of money borrowed under this Act.

4 This Act may be cited as "The Launceston Sewerage Act, No. 5." Short title.
