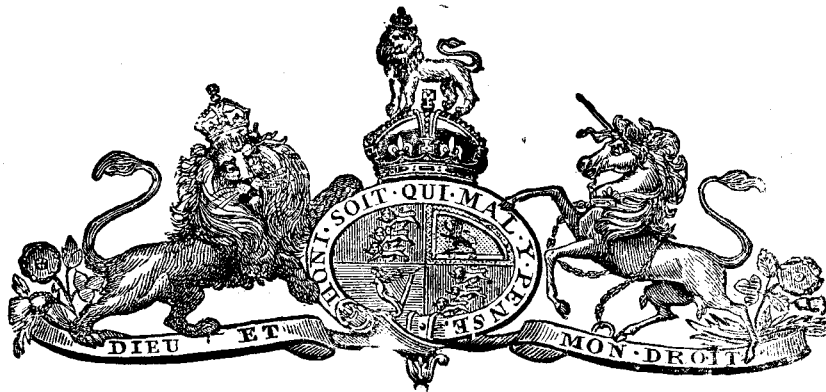

ANALYSIS.

1. Short title and incorporation.
2. During state of war Governor may exempt lessees and licensees from certain covenants.
Exemption to have effect until revoked.



AN ACT to amend "The Mining Act, 1905." A.D. 1914.
—
 [3 September, 1914.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Mining Act, 1914," and shall be deemed to be incorporated with and be construed as one with "The Mining Act, 1905" (hereinafter referred to as "The Principal Act"), and every amendment thereof. Short title and incorporation with 5 Ed. VII. No. 23.

2—(1) The Governor may from time to time, whilst a state of war exists between Great Britain and any foreign State, by proclamation exempt all lessees and licensees generally without naming them, or any particular class of lessees or licensees without naming them, from -- During state of war Governor may exempt lessees and licensees from certain covenants.

1. In the case of lessees, the covenants of their leases with regard to the expenditure of money :

ii. In the case of licensees, the covenants or conditions of their licences with regard to—

- (a) The completion of authorised works within the specified time:
- (b) The occupation and use of the land affected by the licence with the machinery thereon:
- (c) The use of the right granted or the works authorised by the licence.

(2) Every such proclamation shall fix the date of the commencement of the exemption, and may be retroactive.

Exemption to
have effect until
revoked.

(3) Every such exemption shall have effect until revoked by the Governor by proclamation. The Governor's power of revocation shall be exercisable by him as and when he may, in his discretion, think fit, and in exercising such power he may discriminate in any way he may think fit.

(4) A grant under this section of exemption from any covenant in a lease or licence shall be deemed a waiver of the right of the Governor or any board or person whomsoever, to enforce the forfeiture of the lease or licence for breach of such covenant committed before such exemption.
