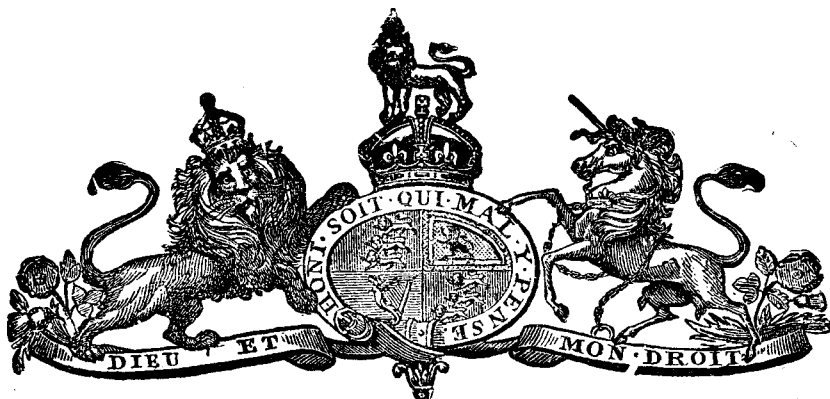

1. Short title.
2. Celebration of marriage without fee in certain cases.
Retrospective operation.

AN ACT to amend the Marriage Act, 1895. A.D. 1929.
[25 July, 1929.] —

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Marriage Act, 1929.” Short title.

2—(1) In any case in which the Treasurer is satisfied that the circumstances are such as to justify the remission of any fee payable under the Marriage Act, 1895, the Registrar-General or any Registrar, with the approval in writing of the Treasurer, may remit any such fee, and the marriage may be celebrated without payment thereof. (2) This section shall be deemed to have come into force on, and to have had effect from, the twenty-first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight. Retrospective operation.
