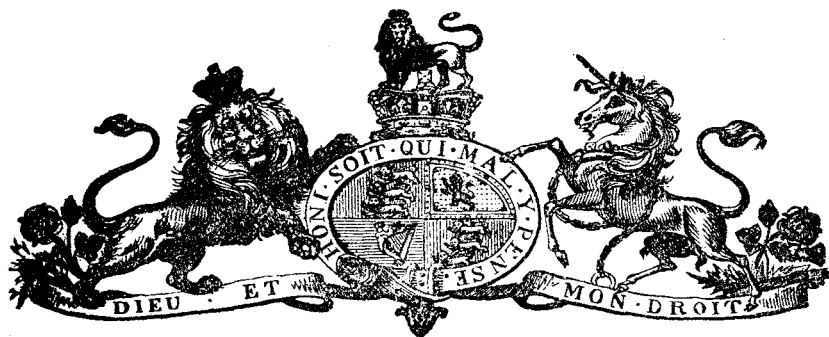

AN ACT to further amend "The Master and Servant Act, 1856." [24 November, 1884.] A.D. 1884.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 In this Act the expression "the said Act" means "The Master and Servant Act, 1856," and every Amendment thereof. Interpretation. 19 Vict. No. 28.

2 So much of Sections Fifteen and Sixteen of the said Act as authorises a Justice of the Peace to issue his Warrant in the first instance for the arrest of any servant, apprentice, or labourer, is hereby repealed. Warrant for arrest of servant not to issue in first instance.

3 Section Seventeen of the said Act is hereby repealed; but such repeal shall not affect any proceedings pending or any Recognizance entered into under the said Section, and such proceedings may be continued and such Recognizance may be enforced in case of breach thereof notwithstanding such repeal. Repeal.

4 The said Act as amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

5 This Act may be cited as "The Master and Servant Act, 1884." Short title.
