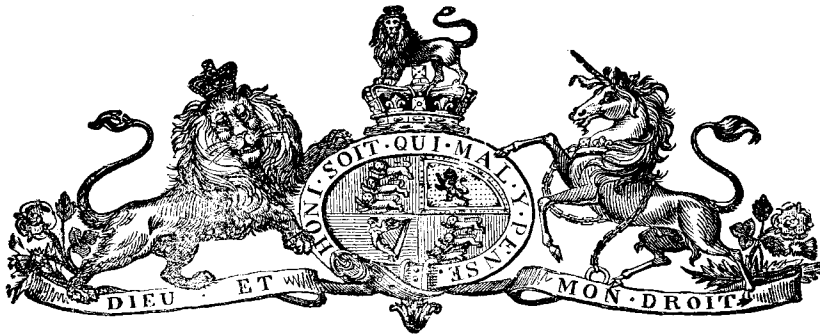

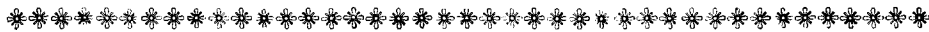

AN ACT to further amend "The Master and Servant Act, 1856." [31 August, 1887.] A.D. 1887.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 In this Act the expression "the said Act" means "The Master and Servant Act, 1856," and every Amendment thereof. Interpretation. 19 Vict. No. 28.

2 In all proceedings before a Justice or Justices under the said Act, the Defendant shall in all cases be competent but not compellable to give evidence, anything contained in any law or practice to the contrary notwithstanding. Defendant a competent witness.

3 The said Act, as amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

4 This Act may be cited as "The Master and Servant Act, 1887." Short title.
