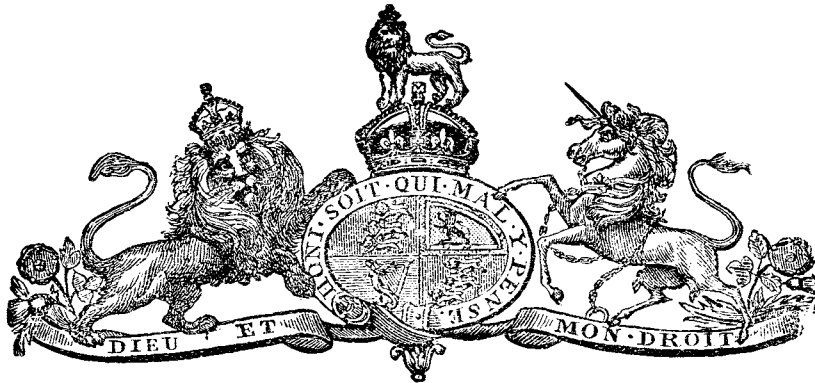

AN ACT to amend the Mines and Works Regulation Act, 1915. [29 October, 1930.] <sup>A.D.</sup> 1930.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Mines and Works Regulation Act, 1930.”

**2** The Mines and Works Regulation Act, 1916, is amended by deleting the words “a warden in his capacity of” in the fourth and fifth lines of Section Seventy-six.
