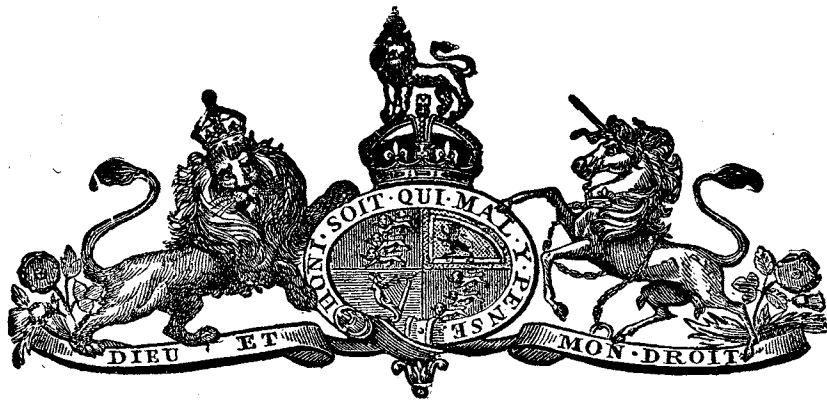

AN ACT to further amend "The Marine Boards Act, 1889," and for other purposes. A..D

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Marine Boards Act Amendment Act, 1913," and shall be construed as one with "The Marine Boards Act, 1889" (hereinafter called the Principal Act), and every amendment thereof. Short title and

2 Section Forty-four of the Principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted therefor :— Repeal of Section
44 of Principal
Act.

"**44** Every Marine Board may sit in committee of the whole Board, and every Board may appoint such committees consisting of such number of Wardens and for such general or special purposes or

matters as such Board may deem expedient, and every Committee of the whole shall report to the Board either forthwith or at the following meeting of the Board, and every other Committee shall conduct its business in accordance with the general or special directions of the Board, and shall submit all its acts and proceedings to the Board for approval."

3 Section One hundred and thirty of the Principal Act, as re-enacted by Section Eleven of "The Marine Boards Act, 1903," is hereby amended by repealing lines Thirty-nine to Forty-eight inclusive, constituting the paragraph of which the marginal note is "Certificates of Masters," and substituting therefor the following words:—

Certificates of
masters and mates.

"To grant certificates of competency to masters and mates of steamships or of sailing ships trading on any river or in, to, from, or between any port or ports in Tasmania and not required by any other Act to be commanded by a master or to carry a mate having a certificate of competency or service granted by any other authority, and also to suspend or cancel any such certificate: Provided however that every such grant, suspension, or cancellation of any such certificate shall be in accordance with regulations made by the Governor."

4 Section One hundred and fifty-seven of "The Marine Board's Act, 1889" is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following words:—

"or if no passenger is carried on such steamship or sailing ship as aforesaid not less than Five pounds."
