

AN ACT to amend "The Mineral Leases Act, A.D. 1876. 1870." [20 November, 1876.]

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend "The Mineral Leases Act, PREAMBLE. 34 Vict. No. 11.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to appoint officers, Commissioners to be called Commissioners of Mines for Tasmania, or for any part of Mines may be thereof, as he sees fit, who shall have and exercise such powers and appointed. duties as may be assigned to them by this Act and the Regulations made under "The Mineral Leases Act, 1870."

2 For the purpose of deciding any dispute which may arise between Commissioners any two or more persons under the said or this Act or the regulations may take evidence made by the Governor in Council, it shall be lawful for any Commissioner for deciding disappointed under this Act to receive evidence, and to administer oaths, and putes. to examine witnesses, and to determine such dispute, and in all respects conduct such enquiry as any Justice of the Peace may lawfully proceed to hear and determine any matter depending before him.

- 3 This Act and "The Mineral Leases Act, 1870," shall, save as Acts to be read amended by this Act, be read and construed together as one Act. together.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as "The Mineral Leases Amendment Act." Short title.
