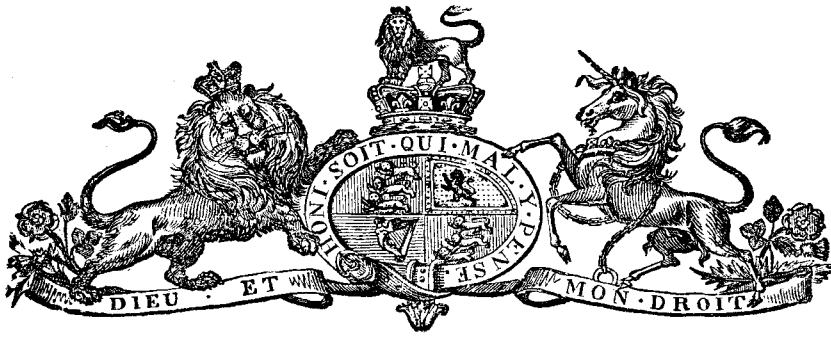

AN ACT to provide for the Survey of a Line of Railway between *Hobart Town* and *Launceston*.  
[17 September, 1868.]

**W**HEREAS it is expedient that a Parliamentary Survey should be forthwith made for a Line of Railway between *Hobart Town* and *Launceston*, and that the Cost of constructing such Railway should be ascertained: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

**1** It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause the Survey for a Line of Railway between *Hobart Town* and *Launceston* to be forthwith made, and for that purpose to appoint such and so many Engineers and Surveyors as he deems necessary in that behalf, and to cause such Engineers and Surveyors to be paid such reasonable sums as he sees fit out of moneys to be provided by Parliament.

Governor in Council may cause Survey to be made. Appointment of Engineers, &c.

**2** It shall be lawful for such Engineers and Surveyors, together with their assistants, workmen, and others, to enter upon all such lands as they may deem necessary to enter upon, and if necessary to fell indigenous timber, for the purpose of making such Survey as aforesaid; and also to ascertain the nature and quality of any land through which such Survey may be carried, and for such purpose to make such cuttings and excavations in the soil of such lands as they think fit, doing as little injury thereto as reasonably may be.

Engineers may enter upon Lands.

**3** This Act may be cited as "The Main Line Railway Survey Act." Short Title.
