AN ACT to amend an Act, intituled An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws now in force in this Island regulating the Practice of Medicine therein. [11 October, 1867.]

W HEREAS an Act of Council of this Island was passed in the PREAMBLE. Sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to 6 Vict. No. 2. amend and consolidate the Laws now in force in this Island regulating the Practice of Medicine therein, and by the Sixth Section of the said Act it was enacted, that if any person not being a Vendor of Medicine at the time of the passing of the said Act should at any time thereafter vend any Medicine or Drug without having obtained a Licence so to do from the President and Two or more Members of the Court in the said Act mentioned, every person so offending should forfeit a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds: And whereas it is expedient to facilitate the sale of Medicines and Drugs at places where no person licensed to sell Medicines or Drugs may reside: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 No person shall, after the passing of this Act, incur any penalty by No penalty for selling Medicines or Drugs at any place which is distant more than selling Medicines, Two miles from the place of business of any person who has obtained such Licence as in the said recited Act is mentioned, provided such Medicines or Drugs shall be sold in unopened packages made up by, and bearing the label of, some person who has obtained such Licence as aforesaid, and not otherwise.

Medical Practitioners.

Medical Practitioners may vend Drugs. 2 It shall be lawful for every legally qualified Medical Practitioner to vend any Medicine or Drugs without having obtained any Licence so to do, anything in the said Act or in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Short title.

3 This Act may be cited as "The Medical Practitioners Amendment Act."
