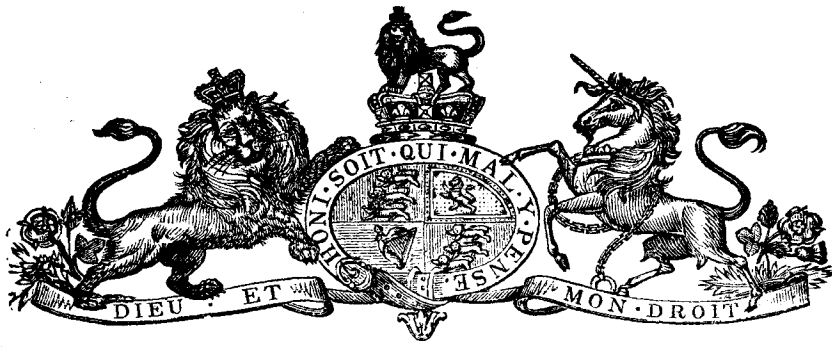

AN ACT to provide for the Construction of certain Main Roads and Bridges. A.D. 1889.

[5 December, 1889.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines— Interpretation.  
“The Minister” means the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being, and includes any person appointed by him or acting under his order.

**2** It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed, completed, or improved, the several Main Roads and Bridges mentioned in the Schedule (1.), at a cost for each separate Work not exceeding the amounts set forth in the said Schedule respectively. Minister to cause Works to be constructed.

**3** The cost of the several Works specified in the Schedule (1.) shall be defrayed out of the moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose. Defrayment of cost of Works.

**4** It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be improved the several Roads mentioned in the Schedule (2.), at a cost for each separate Work not exceeding the amounts set forth in the said Schedule (2.) respectively. Works in Schedule (2.) to be improved.

The cost of the said several Works shall be defrayed out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony for the year 1890; and the Treasurer of the Colony, upon the Governor’s Warrant, may issue and pay out of the said Fund any sum or sums of money not exceeding in amount the sums of money in the said Schedule (2.) specified. Defrayment of cost.

Short title.

**5** All powers by this Act conferred upon the Minister may be exercised by him or by any person acting under his written authority in that behalf, anything contained in the Fifty-second Section of "The Roads Act, 1884," to the contrary notwithstanding.

**6** All the provisions contained in "The Main Roads and Bridges Construction Act, 1881," shall extend and apply to the construction, completion, and improvement of the several Main Roads and Bridges mentioned in the Schedule (1.) and (2.) to this Act, as fully in all respects as if the said provisions had been incorporated in this Act.

**7** The word "Lefroy," in the Eighth item in the Schedule to "The Main Roads and Bridges Construction Act, 1889," is hereby expunged, and in lieu thereof the words "George Town" is hereby inserted; and the said Schedule shall hereafter be read as if the words "George Town" had always been inserted therein.

**8** This Act may be cited as "The Main Roads and Bridges Construction Act, 1889."
