AN ACT to amend "An Act to improve the A.D. 1877. Administration of the Law so far as respects summary Proceedings before Justices of the Peace." |11 December 1877.] 111 December, 1877.]

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to amend the Act of the PREAMBLE. Parliament of Tasmania of the 24th Victoria, No. 5: 24 Vict. No.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :----

1 The Act of the Parliament of *Tasmania* of the 24th Victoria, Short title. No. 5, may be cited as "The Magistrates' Stated Cases Act, 1860," and this Act may be cited as "The Magistrates Stated Cases Act, 1860," and the said Act and this Act may be referred to as "The Magistrates' Stated Cases Acts, 1860 and 1877."
