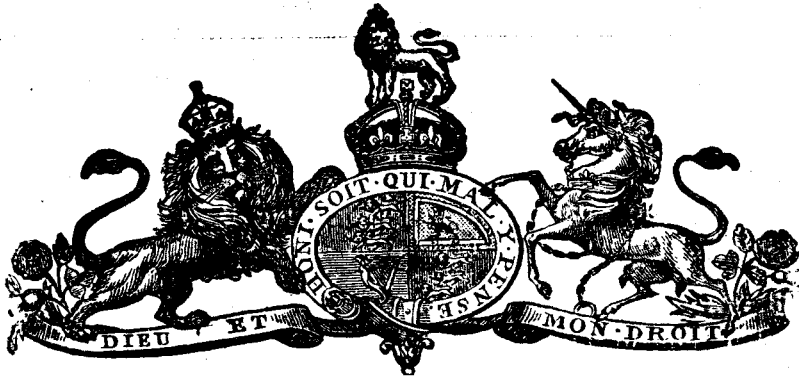

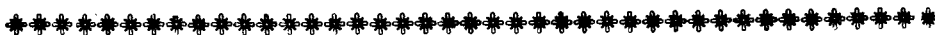

ANALYSIS.

1. Short title and incorporation with 7 Ed. VII. No. 27.
2. Governor may make special regulations in the case of motor vehicles brought temporarily into State.
3. Commissioner of Police may grant permission to clubs to hold contests.



AN ACT to amend "The Motor Traffic Act, 1907." [20 December, 1910.] ^{A.D.} 1910.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Motor Traffic Act, 1910," and shall be incorporated and read as one with "The Motor Traffic Act, 1907."

2 The Governor may from time to time make special regulations in the case of motor vehicles brought temporarily into this State by persons resident beyond this State and intending to make only a temporary stay 4d.]

in this State, and of drivers entering this State for the purpose of driving any such motor vehicles.

Any such regulations shall supersede any other regulations so far as expressly stated therein.

Any such regulations may impose a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds for any breach thereof.

3 The Commissioner of Police may, in his discretion, on the application in writing of any automobile or motor cycle club, and with the consent of the council of the municipality, grant by writing under his hand permission to the club to use during a specified time any specified public roads for speed or hill-climbing contests to the extent mentioned in the permission, and at a rate of speed exceeding Twenty-five miles an hour, subject to such conditions (including payment of a deposit or expenses) as the said Commissioner may think fit.

Such conditions shall be embodied in the written permission.

Every such club to which any such permission is granted shall comply with the terms and conditions subject to which the permission is granted.
