

AN ACT to further amend the Law relating A.D. 1899. to Offences against the Person.

[29 September, 1899.]

W HEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to Offences PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Offences against the Person Act, Short title. 1899."
- 2 Sections Nine to Thirteen inclusive, and Sections Fifty-nine to Repeal. Sixty-one inclusive of the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania, 27 27 Vict. No 5. Victoriæ, No. 5, are hereby repealed, except as to anything heretofore duly done thereunder, and except as far as may be necessary for the purpose of supporting and continuing any proceeding taken, or of prosecuting or punishing any person for any offence committed before the passing of this Act.

#### Attempts to Murder.

3 Whosoever shall administer to, or cause to be administered to or Administering to be taken by, any person any poison or other destructive thing, or shall by any means whatsoever wound or cause any grievous bodily harm to any person, with intent in any of the cases aforesaid to commit Murder, shall be guilty of Felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for Life.

## Offences against the Person.

### **A.D. 189**9.

Destroying or damaging a building with gunpowder with intent to Murder.

Setting fire to or casting away a ship with intent to Murder.

- 4 Whosoever, by the explosion of gunpowder or other explosive substance, shall destroy or damage any building with intent to commit Murder, shall be guilty of Felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for Life.
- 5 Whosoever shall set fire to any ship or vessel, or any part thereof, or any part of the tackle, apparel, or furniture thereof, or any goods or chattels being therein, or shall cast away or destroy any ship or vessel, with intent in any of such cases to commit Murder, shall be guilty of Felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for Life.

Attempting to administer poison, or shooting or attempting to shoot, or attempting to drown, &c., with intent to Murder.

6 Whosoever shall attempt to administer to, or shall attempt to cause to be administered to, or to be taken by, any person any poison or other destructive thing, or shall shoot at any person, or shall, by drawing a trigger or in any other manner, attempt to discharge any kind of loaded arms at any person, or shall attempt to drown, suffocate, or strangle any person, with intent, in any of the cases aforesaid, to commit Murder, shall, whether any bodily injury be effected or not, be guilty of Felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for Life.

By any other to commit Murder.

7 Whosoever shall, by any means other than those specified in any means attempting of the preceding Sections of this Act, attempt to commit Murder shall be guilty of Felony, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for Life.

#### Unnatural Offences.

Sodomy.

8 Whosoever shall be convicted of the abominable crime of Buggery, committed either with mankind or with any animal, shall be liable to be imprisoned for Life.

Attempt to commit an infamous crime.

9 Whosoever shall attempt to commit the said abominable crime, or shall be guilty of any assault with intent to commit the same, or of any indecent assault upon any male person, shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Ten years.

Definition of Incest.

10 Any person, being related either as parent and child or brother and sister, who shall commit fornication with each other shall be deemed to have been guilty of the crime of Incest.

Incest.

11 Whosoever shall be convicted of the crime of Incest shall be guilty of Felony, and being convicted thereof, shall be liable to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding Seven years, with hard labour.

This Act to be read with 27 Vict. No. 5.

12 This Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with the said Act of the 27th Victoriæ, No. 5, and shall be read and construed as if this Act and the said Act, save as altered or amended by this Act, were one Act.
