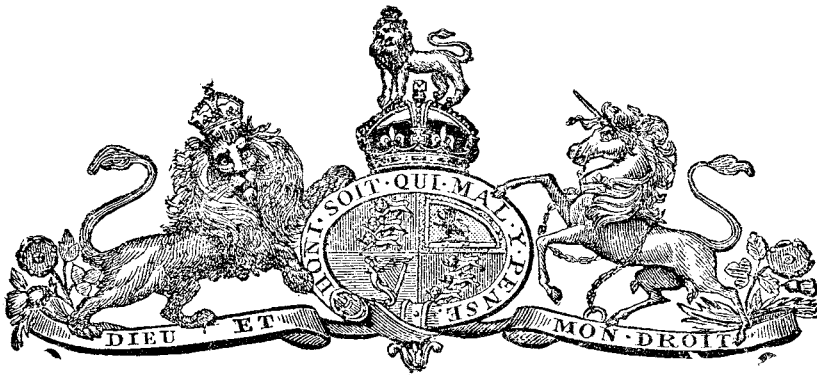

AN ACT to provide for certain Percentage Reductions in Salaries Payable to Ministers of the Crown, and to Members and Officers of Parliament, and to Persons Employed by or on behalf of the State.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Official Salaries Reduction.

Application of
Act.**2**—(1) This Act shall apply to—

i. Every person entitled to payment of any salary or allowance under the Ministers of the Crown Act, 1923; the Officers of Parliament Salaries Act, 1927; or the Payment of Members Act, 1927: and

ii. Every person employed by the State, or by any person, body, or authority constituted by any Act or appointed by the Governor, under the authority of any Act to administer or control any department, business, or undertaking on behalf of the State.

(2) Every person designated or employed as aforesaid is hereinafter called an “officer,” and the term salary hereinafter used shall include any allowance payable under any of the abovementioned Acts.

(3) No self-governing institution or body to which any grant or subsidy is paid by the State shall be deemed to be within the provisions of this Act.

Reduction of
salaries.

3 As from the third day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and until the thirtieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, the salary which, but for this Act, would be payable to each officer shall be reduced by the deduction as hereinafter provided of the percentage applicable to the amount of such salary as specified in the schedule hereto.

Application of
reduction.

4—(1) The provisions of Section Three hereof shall be applied by deducting from each payment of salary made to any officer after the said third day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, the prescribed percentage applicable to the amount of such payment.

(2) In respect of all officers whose salaries are payable by the Treasurer, all such deductions as aforesaid shall be made by the Treasurer and the amount thereof retained by him, and in respect of every other officer the person or authority by whom the salary is payable shall make all such deductions as aforesaid.

(3) The amount of every such deduction as aforesaid shall be ascertained by taking the prescribed percentage of the amount payable in each case, and fractions of a penny shall not be taken into consideration.

Salaries not to be
increased.

5—(1) Except as hereinafter provided, no increase in the salary payable at the commencement of this Act to any officer shall be granted or made after the date of such commencement during the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

(2) The provisions of Subsection (1) hereof, shall not apply to or in respect of any officer who at the commencement of this Act is in receipt of a salary not exceeding Two hundred and twenty-one Pounds, and who by reason of having attained a prescribed age or period of service or for other prescribed reasons is or becomes entitled to an increment on the happening of some prescribed event.

Official Salaries Reduction.

(3) The provisions of Subsection (1) hereof shall not prevent the appointment of an officer to any position which may have become vacant at a salary not exceeding the salary paid to his predecessor in such office, or to any new position at such salary as the competent authority in the particular case may determine. 6 Nothing in this Act shall prejudice or affect any right of any officer or his representatives under the provisions of the Public Servants' Retiring and Death Allowances Act, 1925, or any resolution of Parliament making the like provision. Retiring allowances not to be affected.

SCHEDULE.

PERCENTAGE DEDUCTIONS.

1. Where the salary or allowance is payable under the provisions of any of the Acts specified in Section Two of this Act, the percentage deduction applicable to each amount payable as thereby provided shall be at the rate of 10 per cent.

2. In any other case—

Where the rate of annual salary payable to the officer—	The percentage deduction applicable in each payment shall be —	
	If the officer is married or has dependants.	In any other case.
Exceeds £60 and does not exceed £300	2½ per cent.	5 per cent.
Exceeds £300 and does not exceed £400	5 per cent.	7½ per cent.
Exceeds £400 and does not exceed £600	7½ per cent.	} 10 per cent.
Exceeds£600	8½ per cent.	

Provided, however, that on the application of this schedule—

- I. Where the deduction prescribed as above has the effect of reducing the payment to any officer below the amount paid to any officer who is in receipt of salary at a lower annual rate, such deduction as aforesaid shall be of such amount only as will make the payment in both such cases equal.
- II. Where an unmarried officer satisfies the Public Service Commissioner by statutory declaration that he is wholly or substantially supporting any child, parent, grandchild, sister, or brother of such officer, the deduction from his payment shall be at the rate prescribed for a married officer.
