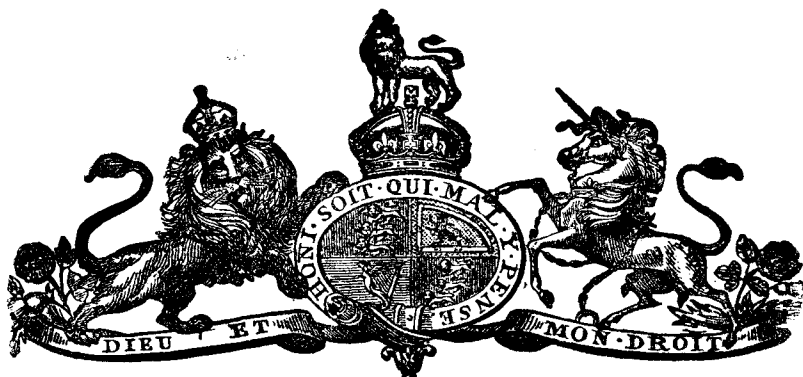

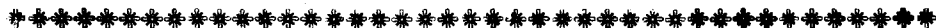

AN ACT to amend the Official Salaries Reduction Act, 1930. [11 November, 1930.] A.D. 1930.

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “ The Official Salaries Reduction Act Short-title. (No. 2), 1930.”

Amendment of  
21 Geo. V. No. 4.**2** The Official Salaries Reduction Act, 1930, is hereby amended—

- i. By adding after the word “State” at the end of Paragraph ii. of Subsection (1) of Section Two thereof the words “except any person employed as aforesaid whose remuneration is determined or is subject to any determination made, or which may be made, under the provisions of any Commonwealth Act”:
- ii. By adding after the word “aforesaid” in the last line of Subsection (2) of Section Four thereof the words “and shall pay the amount thereof to the Treasurer forthwith (except in the case of any salary which is paid out of loan moneys), and such amounts shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue”: and
- iii. By inserting after the word “rate” in the third line of Paragraph i. of the proviso to the schedule thereto the words “and who is employed in the same Department”:
- iv. By inserting after Division 2 of the schedule thereto the following new Division 3:—

“3. For the purposes of this Act the annual salary of an officer shall be the aggregate amount payable at a fixed annual rate or rates to such officer by way of remuneration in respect of the duties of any offices held by him, whether under the name of salary or allowance, and, in the case of wages paid at a rate based on any shorter period than one year, shall mean the amount of such wages which, calculated at the rate aforesaid, would be payable in respect of a full year’s service.”
