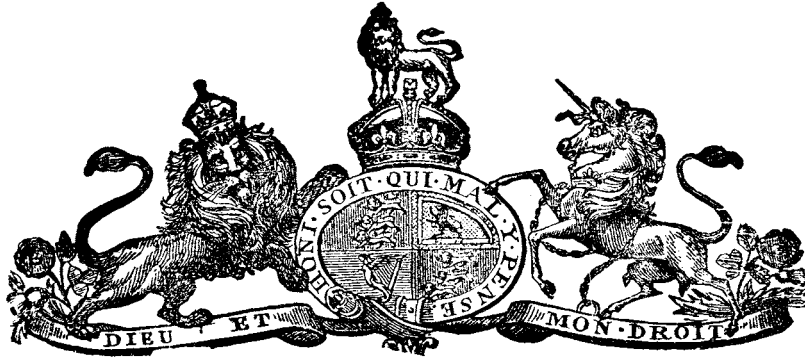

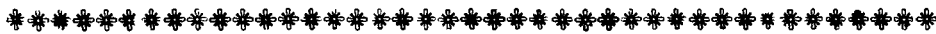

AN ACT to amend "The Prison Act, 1868." A.D. 1924.  
[2 December, 1924.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**3** After Section Twelve of "The Prison Act, 1868," the following new Section Thirteen is hereby inserted :—

"**13** The Governor may, in the month of January in each year, appoint two justices for the ensuing year for each gaol under the control of the Sheriff, each of whom shall personally visit the gaol in respect of which he is appointed at least once in every month, or oftener if occasion shall require, for the purpose of examining into the treatment, behaviour, and condition of the persons confined therein, and the state and condition of the gaol; and such justices shall hold office until their successors are appointed."

Existing visiting

**4** The persons holding office at the time of the commencement of this Act as visiting justices to the gaol at Hobart shall continue in such office until their successors are appointed in the month of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.
