

AN ACT to further amend The Police Act, 1865. [27 December, 1872.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal so much of The Police Act, PRRAMBLE. 1865, as prohibits bathing in any part of the North Esk or South Esk 29 Vict. No. 10, Rivers or the River Tamar within the limits of the Town of Launceston:

Solution of Tamar and Line Expedience the Governor of Tamaria.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 So much of the Twenty-first Section of The Police Act, 1865, as Part of Sect. 21 enacts that it shall not be lawful for any person to bathe in any part of the North Esk or South Esk Rivers or the River Tamar within the limits of the Town of Tamar within the limits of the Town of Launceston is hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not affect any offence committed before the commencement of this Act, which may be dealt with in all respects as if this Act had not been passed.

- 2 This Act and the said Act, and "The Police Act Amendment, Acts to be read 1867," save as altered or amended by this Act, shall be read and together. construed together as one Act.
 - 3 This Act may be cited as "The Police Act Amendment, 1872." Short title.
