AN ACT to further amend *The Police Act*,  
1865. [27 December, 1872.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal so much of *The Police Act*, 1865, as prohibits bathing in any part of the *North Esk* or *South Esk* Rivers or the River *Tamar* within the limits of the Town of *Launceston* : PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 So much of the Twenty-first Section of *The Police Act*, 1865, as enacts that it shall not be lawful for any person to bathe in any part of the *North Esk* or *South Esk* Rivers or the River *Tamar* within the limits of the Town of *Launceston* is hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not affect any offence committed before the commencement of this Act, which may be dealt with in all respects as if this Act had not been passed. repealed.

2 This Act and the said Act, and “*The Police Act Amendment*, 1867,” save as altered or amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read  
together.

3 This Act may be cited as “*The Police Act Amendment*, 1872.” Short title.
