

AN ACT to amend "The Pharmacy Act, 1908." [11 November, 1910.]

**1910**.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 This Act may be cited as "The Pharmacy Amendment Act, Short title and 1910," and shall be incorporated and read as one with "The Pharmacy incorporation with Act 1908." in this Act referred to as the Principal Act. 8 Edw. VII, Act, 1908," in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

## Pharmacy Amendment.

A.D. 1910.

Amendment of Section 2 of Principal Act 2 Section Two of the Principal Act is hereby amended by inserting the following definition at the end thereof, namely:—

"Registered Pharmaceutical Chemist" means a pharmaceutical chemist who is the holder of a certificate in force under Section Twenty-three of this Act"

Amendment of Section 6 of Principal Act. 3 Section Six of the Principal Act is hereby amended by inserting the word "registered" immediately before the word "pharmaceutical" throughout the section wherever the word "registered" is not now so inserted.

Repeal of Section 7 of Principal Act.
Amendment of Section 18 of Principal Act.

4 Section Seven of the Principal Act is hereby repealed.

5 Section Eighteen of the Principal Act is hereby amended by inserting at the end of the section the words "and such chemist shall on demand pay to the Board the cost of such publication."

Repeal of Section 19 of Principal Act and substitution of new section therefor.

- 6 Section Nineteen of the Principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted therefor:—
- "19 A copy of the 'Gazette' purporting to contain any such list or extract as is referred to in the immediately preceding section, or a document purporting to be signed by the Registrar, and to be a copy of any such list or extract, shall be prima facie evidence in all courts of justice, and in all legal proceedings whatsoever, that the persons who by such list, extract, or document appear to be pharmaceutical chemists who have taken out certificates under Section Twenty-three of this Act for the year therein referred to, are registered pharmaceutical chemists in respect of that year."

Amendment of Section 21 of Principal Act.

- 7—(1.) Section Twenty-one of the Principal Act is hereby amended by inserting at the end of line Six of Paragraph III., after the word "drugs," the words " or as an apprentice to a registered pharmaceutical chemist in actual charge of a Friendly Society's Dispensary."
- (2.) The forms in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules to the Principal Act may, whenever necessary, be altered in accordance with this amendment.

Amendment of Section 23 of Principal Act. 8 Section Twenty-three of the Principal Act is hereby amended by omitting therefrom the words "to be entered upon the register, and" occurring in line Five.

Omission to take out annual certificate for more than Twelve months. 9 Every pharmaceutical chemist who for a period exceeding Three years ceases to hold an annual certificate in force under Section Twenty-three of the Principal Act, and afterwards applies for such certificate, shall not be entitled to receive one unless he first satisfied the Board as to the circumstances under which he omitted or ceased to take out his certificate, or to practise as a pharmaceutical chemist, and as to his conduct and employment in the meantime,

10 Section Thirty of the Principal Act is hereby amended by A.D. 1910. inserting at the end of the section the words "or who not being a Amendment of registered pharmaceutical chemist, in any way directly or indirectly Section 30 of vends, or attempts to vend, any medicine or drug, except in the cases Principal Act. authorised by this Act."

- 11 Section Thirty-one of the Principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted therefor:
  - "31 Every pharmaceutical chemist commits an offence who -
    - 1. Keeps or maintains any place of business for the vending of medicines or drugs, or the compounding or dispensing of prescriptions, unless he or another registered pharmaceutical chemist is and continues in charge of and constantly and personally superintends the business:

Repeal of Section 31 of Principal Act and substitution of new section therefor.

- II. Permits any person other than another registered pharmaceutical chemist, or other than an assistant, whom he or such other registered pharmaceutical chemist employs and controls, to vend medicines or drugs or compound or dispense prescriptions."
- 12 Section Thirty-nine of the Principal Act is hereby amended by Amendment of inserting after "drugs," in line Five, "other than patent and proprietary medicines."

Principal Act.

13 On the Thirtieth day of January in every year, commencing Refirement of with the year One thousand nine hundred and eleven, certain of the members of the Board shall go out of office by rotation, as hereinafter provided, and on a prior day in the same month an election shall be held to supply their places, and the persons elected shall assume office on their predecessors going out of office.

14—(1.) The members of the Board at the time of this Act coming Order of retireinto operation shall go out of office in the following order, namely:—

- On the Thirtieth day of January, in the year One thousand nine hundred and eleven, James Tomkins Weaver and Arthur Joshua Beaumont shall retire;
- On the Thirtieth day of January, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twelve, Henry Thomas Gould and Walter James Clewer shall retire;
- On the Thirtieth day of January, in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, William Blockley Drake, Percy Ash, and Martin Rushton shall retire;

and in every subsequent year thereafter the members to go out of office shall always be the Two who have been longest in office without re-election, save that in every Third year the Three who have been longest in office without re-election shall retire,

## Pharmacy Amendment.

A.D. 1910.

(2.) If at the time when this Act comes into operation the seat of any such member whose name is specifically mentioned in this section is held by some other person, the name of such person shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the name of the member whose seat shall have been vacated and filled up, so that the person who holds the seat at the time when this Act comes into operation shall retire in the year specified, in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
