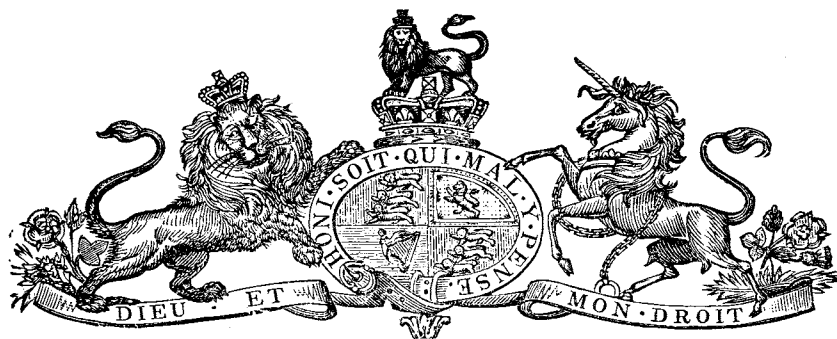

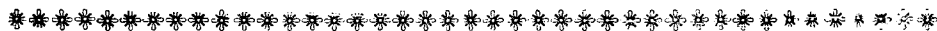

AN ACT to provide for the Erection of A.D. 1892.  
certain Public Buildings.

[21 December, 1892.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—

Interpretation.

“The Minister” means the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being, and includes any person appointed by him or acting under his order.

**2** It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause the several Works mentioned in the Schedule (1.) to be erected, constructed, and completed, at a cost for each separate Work not exceeding the amount therein set opposite such Work.

Minister to cause Works to be constructed.

**3** The cost of the several Works specified in the Schedule shall be defrayed out of the moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Defrayment of cost of Works.

**4** The Governor in Council may, upon the recommendation of the Minister, out of the moneys hereby appropriated, authorise the Minister to purchase, acquire, and take any land, with or without buildings thereon, which he deems suitable for the purposes of any Work by this Act authorised.

Short title.

**5** The unexpended balances of moneys appropriated by the Act of the Parliament of *Tasmania* of the 47 *Victoria*, No. 33, for and towards the items as mentioned in the Schedule (2.) to the amounts respectively therein set forth, shall and may be applied for and towards the erection of Post and Telegraph Offices generally.

**6** The sum of £500, appropriated by "The Public Buildings Erection Act, 1890," for and towards the erection of a "Cottage Hospital, West Coast, (subject to Resolution of House of Assembly of Nineteenth *September*), conditionally upon a like amount being raised by voluntary subscription," shall and may be applied for and towards the erection of Cottage Hospitals, West Coast, such sum to be contributed at the rate of One Pound for every One Pound locally raised and expended for the same purpose.

**7** This Act may be cited as "The Public Buildings Erection Act, 1892."

FIRSTLY, all that piece of land containing one rood and seven perches or thereabouts situate in the City of Hobart, in *Tasmania*, bounded on the south east by one chain fifty two links and one-half of a link or thereabouts north-easterly commencing from the angle formed by *Macquarie-street* with *Elizabeth-street* and extending to land granted to *John Ingle*, on the north-east by two chains and two links or thereabouts north-westerly along the last-mentioned land to the land next hereinafter described, on the north west by one chain and fifty-five links or thereabouts south-westerly along the last-mentioned land to *Elizabeth-street*, and on the south west by one chain and eighty-

nine links or thereabouts south-easterly along Elizabeth-street to the point of commencement. AND SECONDLY, all that piece of land containing nine perches or thereabouts situate in the City of Hobart aforesaid bounded on the south east by a line of two chains and ten links or thereabouts commencing at a point in Elizabeth-street distant one chain and eighty-nine links from the angle formed by that street with Macquarie-street and extending in a north-easterly direction in two bearings first along the land firstly hereinbefore described and then along the land granted to the said John Ingle to land granted to David Lord, on the north east by a straight line of thirty-three links extending in a north-westerly direction along the last-mentioned land to other land granted to the said David Lord, on the north west by a straight line of thirty-two links and one quarter of a link extending south-westerly along the said last-mentioned land to a brick building, thence on the south west by a straight line of sixteen links and one quarter of a link extending in a south-easterly direction along the said building, thence again on the north west by a straight line of twenty-five links extending in a south-westerly direction also along the said building, thence again on the north east by a straight line of nine links extending in a north-westerly direction again along the said brick building to a right-of-way called Lord's Place, thence again on the north-west along the said right-of-way by a straight line of twenty-five links and one half of a link in a south-westerly direction, thence again on the north-east by a straight line of two links and one half of a link extending in a north-westerly direction along the said right-of-way, thence again on the north west by a straight line of one hundred and thirty-five links and one half of a link extending in a south-westerly direction along the said right-of-way to Elizabeth-street aforesaid, and thence on the south west by a straight line of twenty-seven links and one quarter of a link extending in a south-easterly direction along Elizabeth-street to the point of commencement.
