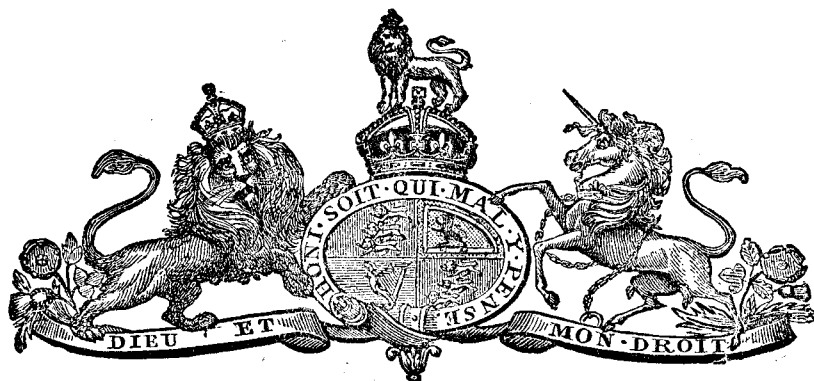

AN ACT to amend the Potato Diseases Act, <sup>A.D.</sup> 1930.  
 1909. [23 December, 1930.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The Potato Diseases Act, 1930.”

**2** Section Two of the Potato Diseases Act, 1909, is hereby amended by expunging the definition of "Potato" and substituting therefor the following definition:—

“‘Potato’ includes tomato, carrot, parsnip, and turnip, and the plant of potato, tomato, carrot, parsnip and turnip:’”.

**3**—(1) It shall be lawful for the Minister at the beginning of each financial year to pay to the Potato Marketing Board, out of the moneys from time to time standing to the credit of the Potato Diseases Fund Account, an amount calculated at a prescribed rate or rates for all potatoes of the respective classes in respect of which an inspection fee has been received by the Department of Agriculture in the preceding financial year.

(2) The Treasurer may issue and apply out of the said account such amount as the Minister shall certify to be payable to the said Board under this section.

(3) The said Board shall apply all moneys received by it under this section for the purposes of dealing with the problem of marketing potatoes produced in this State, and in furtherance of the objects for which the said Board was elected.

(4) If at the beginning of any financial year the amount payable to the said Board under this section exceeds the amount standing to the credit of the said account, the Minister may pay to the said Board the amount of such excess out of moneys to be provided by Parliament from the Consolidated Revenue for that purpose.

(5) This section shall be deemed to have had effect as from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty.
