AN ACT to further amend "The Post Office Act, 1881." [7 October, 1895.] A.D. 1895.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Post Office Act, 1881": PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Post Office Amendment Act, 1895." Short title.

2 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Section Sixty-nine of "The Post Office Act, 1881," the Interest payable to depositors upon moneys deposited with the Postmaster-General under the authority of the said Act shall, on and after the First day of *January*, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, be at such rate per centum per annum, not being less than Two Pounds Ten Shillings per centum, as the Governor in Council shall, by notice published in the *Hobart Gazette*, from time to time appoint and determine.

Interest on deposits in Savings Bank to be fixed by Governor in Council. 45 Vict. No. 13.

3 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Seventy-second Section of "The Post Office Act, 1881," any moneys deposited with the Postmaster-General under the authority of the said Act may be placed on deposit in any Bank carrying on business in *Tasmania*, if none of the investments mentioned in the said Section are available.

Money deposited may be placed on deposit in Bank if Government Securities not available. 45 Vict. No. 13.

4 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer from time to time to deduct out of moneys derived from the sale of postage stamps such sum of money as shall be equal to the value of postage stamps deposited as savings in the Post Office Savings Bank, and to place the same to the credit of "The Post Office Savings Account."

5 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer from time to time to pay out of moneys received by him for the sale of postage stamps all sums of money payable by him to any person or company on account of any telegram transmitted or guaranteed, the payment of which has been made by means of postage stamps.

Acts to be read
together.

6 This Act, and "The Post Office Act, 1881," and every Act amending the same, save as amended by this Act, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
