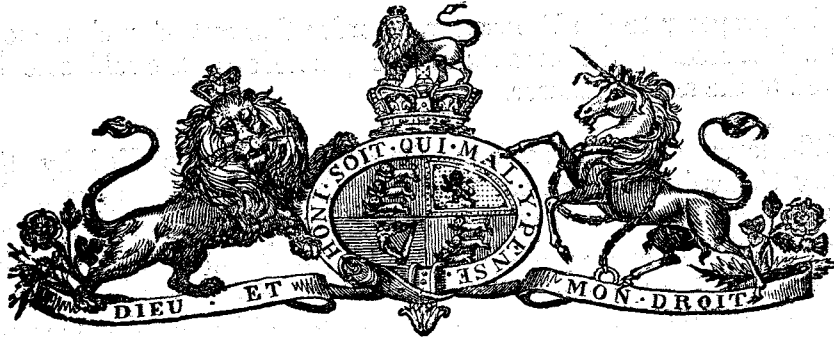

AN ACT to amend "The Post Office Act, 1869." [18 October, 1870.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Post Office Act, 1869:" PREAMBLE. Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, 33 Vict. No. 5. by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 Section Eight of "The Post Office Act, 1869," is hereby repealed. Repeal.

2 Subject to the provisions of the said Act relating to certain Packets Rates of Postage. therein specially mentioned, the following shall be the rates of Postage payable, according to the scale contained in the Seventh Section of the said Act, upon all Letters and Packets received at any Post Office:—

1. Upon all Letters and Packets received at any Post Office for Town Letters. delivery at such Post Office, or at any place within the limits of the City or Town in which such Post Office is situate, the postage shall be One Penny :
2. Upon all Letters and Packets, excepting those hereinbefore provided for, received at any Post Office in this Colony for Inland Letters. delivery within the Colony beyond the boundaries of the City or Town in which such Post Office is situate, the postage shall be Two Pence :

Colonial Ship

3. Upon all Letters and Packets received at any Post Office in this Colony for transmission to any of the *Australian Colonies* or *New Zealand* the postage shall be Three Pence.

Certain letters
and notices to be
free of postage.

3 No Postage shall be charged upon any letter addressed to the Chief Inspector or any Inspector under "The Scab Act, 1870," upon matters connected with that Act, if endorsed with the words "The Scab Act" and the signature of the sender; or any Notice sent to or from such Inspectors if marked "Notice under the Scab Act" and endorsed with the signature of the sender, anything in "The Post Office Act, 1869," to the contrary notwithstanding.

Acts to be read
together.

4 This Act and "The Post Office Act, 1869," shall, save as altered by this Act, be read and construed together as one Act.

Commencement
of Act.

5 This Act shall commence and take effect on the First day of *November*, 1870.

Short title.

6 This Act may be cited as "The Post Office Amendment Act."
