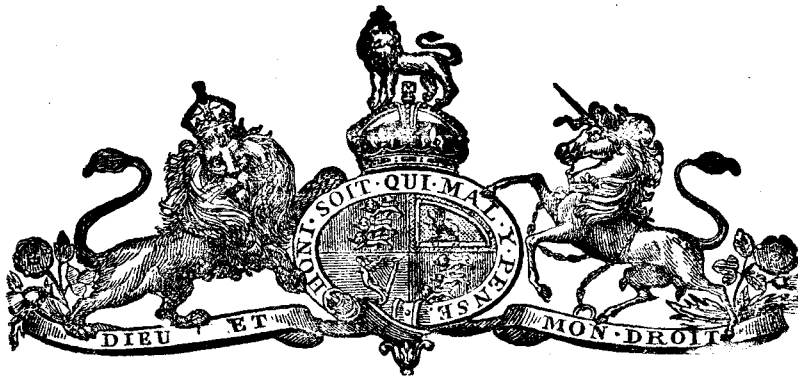

AN ACT to provide for Allowances to Mem-
bers of Parliament, and for other purposes.
[2 August, 1919.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Payment of Members Act, 1919." Short title.
- 2 "The Payment of Members Act, 1913," and "The Payment of Members Amendment Act, 1918," are hereby repealed. Repeal of 4 Geo. V. No. 49 and 9 Geo. V. No. 64.
- 3 In this Act—
"Member" means a Member of the Legislative Council or House of Assembly of the Parliament of Tasmania, as the case may be. Interpretation.
- 4—(1) Except as hereinafter mentioned, every Member shall out of the Consolidated Revenue be entitled to receive an allowance at the rate of Three hundred Pounds per annum hereinafter referred to as "Allowance to a Member." Members of Parliament to receive allowance.

Payment of Members.

In addition to the allowance to a Member, the Leader for the time being of the Opposition shall be also entitled to receive out of the Consolidated Revenue a further allowance at the rate of One hundred Pounds per annum.

(2) The allowance to a Member shall—

- I. In the case of a Member holding his seat at the commencement of this Act, be reckoned from and inclusive of the First day of July, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen :
- II. In the case of any Member elected after the commencement of this Act, be reckoned from the day of his election :
- III. Subject to the provisions of Subsection (3), cease when such Member ceases to be a Member.

(3) Where a Member of the House of Assembly ceases to be a Member thereof by reason of the dissolution of that House, or the expiry thereof by effluxion of time, he shall, notwithstanding such cessation of membership, continue to be entitled to payment of the allowance to a Member—and in the case of the Leader for the time being of the Opposition, to payment of his said further allowance—until the day fixed for the taking of the poll at the general election next following such dissolution or expiry.

How money payable.

5—(1) The amount payable per annum to any Member under the provisions of this Act shall be payable by equal monthly payments upon the last day of each month commencing with the month of July, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

(2) In the event of any Member being entitled to receive such allowance as aforesaid for any portion of a month, the amount payable for such month shall be proportionate to the number of days in such month during which he was so entitled.

Members not entitled to allowance in certain cases.

6 No Member whilst in receipt out of the Consolidated Revenue of the official salary attached to any of the offices mentioned in the following schedule, shall be entitled to receive any allowance under this Act.
