AN ACT to provide for Allowances to Members of Parliament.

1927.

[16 September, 1927.]

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Payment of Members Act, 1927," Short title and and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of commencement. July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.
 - 2 The Payment of Members Act, 1919, is hereby repealed.

3 In this Act, unless the context otherwise indicates or requires, Interpretation. "Member" means a Member of the Legislative Council or House of Assembly of the Parliament of Tasmania.

Payment of Members.

Allowances to members.

- 4—(1) Except as in this Act hereinafter mentioned, every member shall be entitled to receive out of the Consolidated Revenue an allowance at the yearly rate set out in Schedule (1) to this Act opposite to the name of the constituency which he represents in the House of Parliament of which he is a member.
 - (2) Such allowance shall—
 - In the case of a member holding his seat at the commencement of this Act, be reckoned from and inclusive of the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven:
 - II. In the case of any member elected after the commencement of this Act, be reckoned from the day of his election:
 - III. Subject to the provisions of Subsection (3) of this section, cease when such member ceases to be a member.
- (3) When a member of the House of Assembly ceases to be a member thereof by reason of the dissolution of that House, or the expiry thereof by effluxion of time, he shall, notwithstanding such cessation of membership, continue to be entitled to payment of the allowance aforesaid, and, in the case of the Leader of the Opposition, to any other allowance payable to him as such, until the day fixed for the taking of the poll at the general election next following such dissolution or expiry.

How allowance payable.

5 The amount payable per annum to a member under the provisions of this Act shall be payable by equal monthly payments upon the last day of each month commencing with the month of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven; and the provisions of the Apportionment Act, 1871, shall apply to and in respect of every such allowance as first aforesaid, as if the Crown were bound by that Act.

Certain members not entitled to allowances. 6 No member whilst in receipt out of the Consolidated Revenue of the official salary attached to any of the ministerial offices mentioned in Schedule (2) to this Act shall be entitled to receive any such allowance as is referred to in Subsection (1) of Section Four of this Act.
