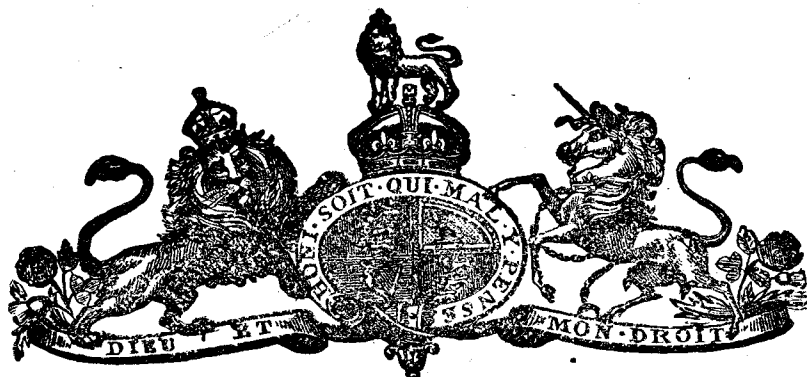

- 1. Short title.
- 2. Presumption of survivorship.

AN ACT to raise a Presumption of Survivorship in certain cases. [21 September, 1921.] ^{A.D.} 1921.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Presumption of Survivorship Act, Short title. 1921.”

2 In all cases where Two or more persons have died in circumstances rendering it uncertain which of them survived, their deaths shall for all purposes affecting the title to any property be presumed to have taken place in order of seniority, and the younger be presumed to have survived the elder. ^{Presumption of survivorship.}
