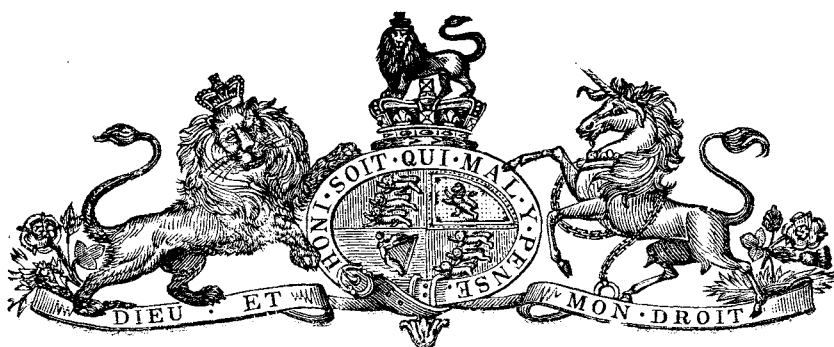

AN ACT to amend "The Police Regulation Act, 1898." [18 October, 1900.] A.D. 1900.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Police Regulation Act, 1898," in the manner hereinafter appearing: PREAMBLE. 62 Vict. No. 48.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The Police Regulation Amendment Act, 1900." Short title.

2 If at the date of the passing of this Act, or at any time thereafter, there shall be standing to the credit of the Reward Branch of the Police Provident Fund a sum in excess of Two hundred and fifty Pounds, then such excess shall from time to time be transferred to the Superannuation Branch of such Fund, and shall be added to and form part of the said Superannuation Branch. Surplus in Reward Branch to be transferred to Superannuation Branch.

3 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Police to receive any sum or sums of money from any local body, company, or person in return for any services rendered by any member or members of the Police Force, and every such sum of money shall be paid into and form part of the said Superannuation Branch. Moneys may be paid into the Superannuation Branch.

4 This Act and "The Police Regulation Act, 1898," shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act. Acts to be read together.
