AN ACT to provide for the Erection of School A.D. 1880. Houses. [20 October, 1880.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :---

1 In this Act—

Interpretation.

"Board" means "The Board of Education :"

"School House" includes the teacher's dwelling attached thereto and all necessary buildings, in any case where the Governor in Council determines that a School House shall be erected with such dwelling and buildings.

2 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the recommendation of the Board, to cause School Houses to be erected and built in such localities as the Board may from time to time determine, and the same shall when erected vest in the Board. Governor in Houses to be erected.

Plans and specifications of any School House or other building proposed to be erected under this Act, together with an estimate of the cost of the proposed erection, shall be laid before and approved of by Parliament before such erection shall be proceeded with.

3 The cost of the erection of such School Houses shall be defrayed Defrayment of out of moneys provided by Parliament from time to time for that cost. purpose.

is vested in the Board, there shall be inserted a clause declaring that the land and the buildings thereon to which it refers, shall be for ever exclusively appropriated for the purposes of the Public School of the locality where it is situated, and that such school shall be for ever open to the children of all religious denominations without distinction, and subject to the control of the Board.

6 "The Public Schools Erection Act, 1874," is hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not affect anything duly done thereunder before the commencement of this Act, or the appropriation for the purposes of this Act of any moneys voted by Parliament for the erection of School Houses under the said Act.

Short title.

7 This Act may be cited as "The Public Schools Erection Act, 1880."
