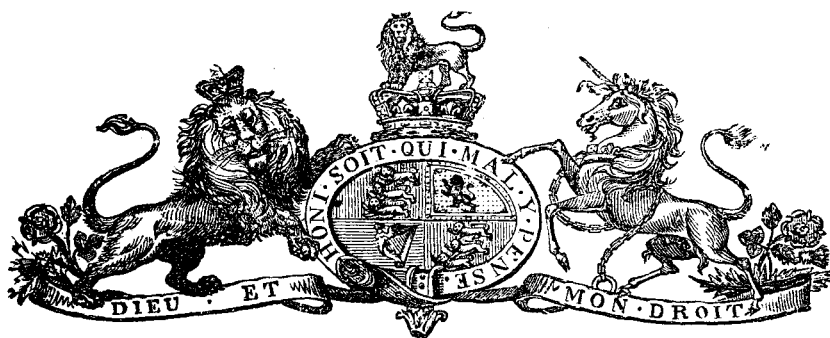

ANNO QUINQUAGESIMO-QUINTO

VICTORIÆ REGINÆ,

No. 57.

AN ACT to provide for the Construction of certain Public Works. [23 December, 1891.] A.D. 1891. —

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—

Interpretation.

“The Minister” means the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being, and includes any person appointed by him or acting under his orders.

2 It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed, completed, improved, or executed, the several Works mentioned in the Schedule, at a cost for each separate Work not exceeding the amounts set forth in the said Schedule respectively. Works to be constructed.

3 The cost of the several Works specified in the said Schedule shall be defrayed out of the moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose: Provided, that no such expenditure shall be incurred for uncommenced Works until the Loan of One and a half million Pounds sterling has been raised under “The Inscribed Stock Act,” (52 *Victoria*, No. 55). Defrayment of cost of Works.

4 All the provisions contained in “The Public Works Construction Act, 1880,” shall extend and apply to the several Works mentioned in the Schedule to this Act, as fully in all respects as if the said provisions had been incorporated in this Act. Provisions of 44 Vict. No. 32 applied.

5 This Act may be cited as “The Public Works Construction Act, 1891.” Short title.
