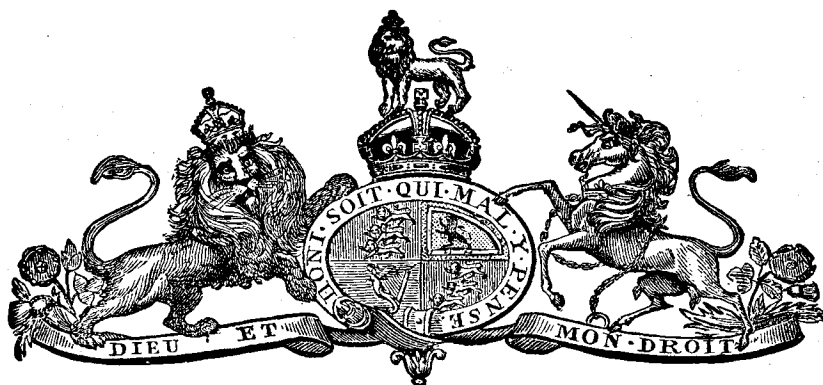

AN ACT to provide for the Execution of certain Public Works. [8 February, 1917.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited for all purposes as “The Public Works Execution Act (No. 1), 1917.” Short title.

**2** In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines, “the Minister” means the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being, and includes any person appointed by him or acting under his orders. Interpretation.

*Public Works Execution (No. 1), 1917.*

- A.D. 1917.  
 Minister to cause works to be constructed.
- 3** It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed, improved, executed, or completed, the works specified in the schedule to this Act at a cost for each separate work not exceeding the amounts set forth in the said schedule.
- Appropriation for works in schedule.
- 4** The cost of the several works specified in the schedule to this Act shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.
- Money not required for work may be expended by Minister on other works.
- 5** If the Minister at any time reports to the Governor that the whole or any portion of the money voted by this Act or any previous Act providing for the execution of public works is not required to be expended upon the work for which such money is voted, it shall be lawful for the Minister to expend such balance, provided it does not exceed Fifty Pounds, upon such other work or works previously authorised by Parliament as he may think fit: Provided that such lastmentioned work is situated in the same city or municipality, as the case may be, as the work for which such money was originally voted.
- Provisions of 44 Vict. No. 32 and 45 Vict. No. 31 to be applicable.
- 6** All the provisions contained in "The Public Works Construction Act, 1880," and "The Branch Roads Construction Act, 1881," shall extend and apply to the works mentioned in the said schedule, as fully in all respects as if the said provisions had been incorporated in this Act.
- Amendment to schedule to 6 Geo. V. No. 59, as to Item 946.
- 7** The schedule to "The Public Works Execution Act (No. 2), 1915," is hereby amended as from the commencement of that Act in regard to Item Nine hundred and forty-six by omitting the words "conditionally upon £200 being contributed locally."
- Amendment to schedule to 6 Geo. V. No. 59, as to Item 945.
- 8** The schedule to "The Public Works Execution Act (No. 2), 1915," is hereby amended as from the commencement of that Act in regard to Item Nine hundred and forty-five (Road, Glenorchy to Kangaroo Valley) by omitting the words "conditionally upon all land being given free and £160 being contributed locally," and substituting therefor "conditionally upon all compensation payable for any land required for the road being contributed locally, and also the sum of £160 being contributed locally."
