

#### ANALYSIS.

- 1. Short title.
- 2. Minister may cause to be constructed the works specified in Schedules (1) and (2).
- 3. Money not required for work may be expended by Minister on other works.
- 4. Provisions of 44 Vict. No. 32 to be applicable.
- 5. Land required may be acquired under 1 Geo. V. No. 11 at option of Minister.
- 6. Treasurer authorised to borrow £23,750.

## AN ACT to provide for the Execution of certain Public Works, and for other purposes.

[19 December, 1927.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Public Works Execution Act Short title. (No. 5), 1927."
- 2—(1) It shall be lawful for the Minister to cause to be constructed, Minister may improved, executed, or completed the works specified in Schedules (1) and (2) to this Act, at a cost for each separate work not exceeding the specified in amount set forth in the said schedules in respect thereof.

#### Public Works Execution (No. 5).

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, if the whole or any portion of the money voted by this Act for or in respect of any item mentioned in Schedule (1) to this Act, is not required to be expended on that item, it shall be lawful for the Minister to expend such unexpended money upon such one or more of the other items mentioned in the said schedule as he shall think fit.

Money not required for work may be expended by Minister on other works. 3 If the Minister at any time reports to the Governor that the whole or any portion of the money voted by this Act or any previous Act providing for the execution of public works is not required to be expended upon the work or item for which such money is voted, it shall be lawful for the Minister to expend such balance, provided it does not exceed Fifty Pounds, upon such other work or works previously authorised by Parliament, as he may think fit: Provided that such lastmentioned work is situated in the same city or municipality, as the case may be, as the work for which such money was originally voted.

Provisions of 44 Vict. No. 32 to be applicable.

4 The provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880, shall extend and apply to the works mentioned in the schedules to this Act as fully in all respects as if the said provisions had been incorporated in this Act.

Land required may be acquired under 1 Geo. V. No. 11, at option of Minister. 5 Notwithstanding anything contained in this or any other Act, any land required for the purpose of any public work authorised by this Act may, at the option of the Minister, be purchased, acquired, or taken under the Lands Resumption Act, 1910, and in the event of such option being exercised the provisions of such Act shall be deemed to be incorporated with this Act, in lieu of the provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880.

Treasurer authorised to borrow £23,750

6 It shall be lawful for the Treasurer to borrow, raise, and receive a total sum not exceeding Twenty-three thousand seven hundred and fifty Pounds for the purposes of this Act.
