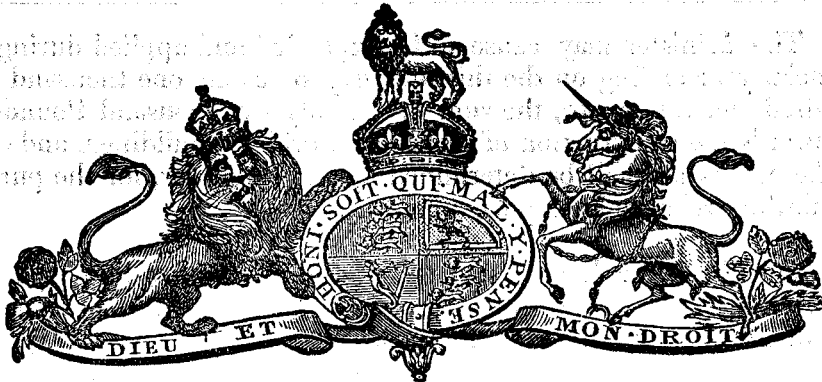

AN ACT to provide for the Expenditure of certain Sums of Money on Public Works for the purpose of affording Relief for Unemployed Persons, and to authorise the Raising of a Sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds for that purpose. [3 August, 1931.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Public Works (Unemployment Relief) Execution Act, 1931.” Short title.

Public Works (Unemployment Relief) Execution.

A.D. 1931.

Power to Minister to expend £25,000 on public works.

2 The Minister may cause to be expended and applied during the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, the sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds for or towards the construction of such roads, bridges, buildings, and other public works as shall be determined by the Governor, for the purpose of affording relief to unemployed persons.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £25,000.

3 The Treasurer may raise, borrow, and receive for the purposes of this Act any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds.

Application of 44 Vict. No. 32 and 45 Vict. No. 31.

4 The provisions of the Public Works Construction Act, 1880, and the Branch Roads Construction Act, 1881, shall apply to the works authorised by this Act in the same manner as if those provisions had been incorporated in this Act.

Application of 1 Geo. V. No. 11 or 58 Vict. No. 17.

5 Any land required for the purpose of any of the works authorised by this Act, at the option of the Minister, may be acquired under the Lands Resumption Act, 1910, or the Land Vesting Act, 1894, and in that event the provisions of those Acts shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Act.
