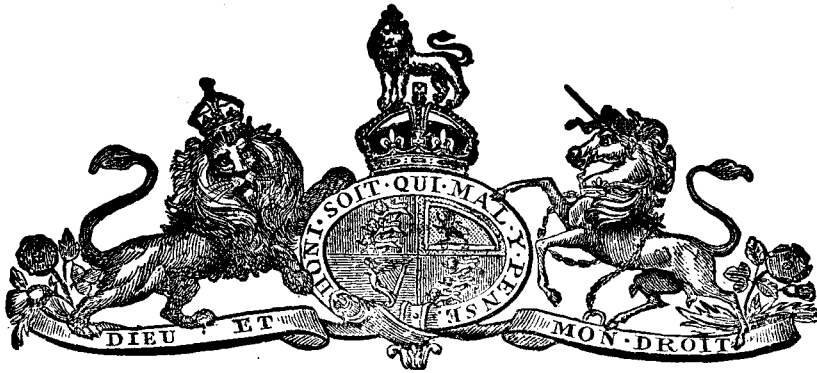

AN ACT to authorise a Loan of Five hundred Pounds to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the Municipality of Queenstown, in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," and for other purposes. [30 December, 1915.]

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of Queenstown has decided to purchase for the sum of Five hundred Pounds the building now used and occupied by the Mount Lyell School of Mines and Industries, such building being situate on land belonging to its corporation, situate in Sticht-street, in the town of Queenstown, such building to be used for the purpose of a public library and reading-room for such town :

PREAMBLE.

And whereas the said Council is desirous of obtaining legislative authority to borrow the money to carry out such purchase under the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890 : "

Queenstown Municipality Loan.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as “The Queenstown Municipality Loan Act, 1915.”

Interpretation.

2 In this Act—

“The Corporation” means the Warden, Councillors, and electors of the Municipality of Queenstown:

“The Council” means the Council of the said Municipality.

Power to borrow
£500.

3 It shall be lawful for the Council, on behalf of the Corporation, to borrow under the provisions of “The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890,” upon the security of its revenues, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole Five hundred Pounds, for the purpose of defraying the cost and expenses of and incidental to purchasing for the sum of Five hundred Pounds the building now used and occupied by the Mount Lyell School of Mines and Industries, such building being situate on land belonging to its corporation, situate in Sticht-street, in the Town of Queenstown, such building to be used for the purpose of a public library and reading-room for such town: Such sum of Five hundred Pounds to be in addition to the sum of Three thousand Pounds authorised to be borrowed under the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania 62 Vict. No. 53, the sum of Four thousand Pounds authorised to be borrowed under the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania 64 Vict. No. 53, and the sum of Two thousand two hundred Pounds authorised to be borrowed under the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania 3 Ed. VII. No. 35.

Power to
Governor in
Council to grant
loan of £500.

4 Subject to the foregoing provisions, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant in accordance with the provisions of “The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890,” any such sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole Five hundred Pounds as a loan to the Council upon the security of all its revenues for the purposes mentioned in Section 3 of this Act, and such sum or sums of money shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Terms and
conditions.

5 The loan authorised by this Act shall be made on and subject to such other terms and conditions as the Governor may impose or approve in all respects.
