

AN ACT to authorise the Loan of Six hun- A.D. 1900. dred Pounds to the Board of the Town of Queenborough in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act. 1890." [6 *December*, 1900.]

W HEREAS the Town Board of Queenborough have constructed PREAMBLE. within the Town of Queenborough Town Board Offices and a Fire-reel Station at an expenditure of Two hundred and eighty-three Pounds and Two Pence, and have constructed certain sewerage works in Russell Crescent within the said town at an expenditure of Ninety-four Pounds Seven Shillings and Ten Pence, making altogether a sum of Three hundred and seventy-seven Pounds Eight Shillings:

And whereas the said Town Board is desirous of constructing further sewerage works and improving the drainage of the said town:

And whereas the said Town Board is desirous of obtaining, under the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," the necessary money to defray the cost of the construction of all such works

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1 This Act may for all purposes be cited as "The Queenborough Short title. Town Board Loan Act, 1900.
- 2 In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines, "Board" Interpretation. shall mean the Town Board of the Town of Queenborough, as proclaimed.

#### Queenborough Town Board Loan.

The Board may borrow money.

3 It shall be lawful for the Board to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding Six hundred Pounds for the purpose of providing the sum of Three hundred and seventy-seven Pounds Eight Shillings expended for the construction of offices, fire-reel station, and sewerage works as aforesaid, and for the purpose of defraying the cost of the construction of such further sewerage works as may be necessary, and of improving the drainage of the said town.

Governor in Council may grant loan under 54 Vict. No. 30. 4 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant, in accordance with the provisions of "The Local Public Works Loans Act, 1890," the sum of Six hundred Pounds as a loan to the said Board for the purposes aforesaid, and such sum of money shall be defrayed out of moneys to be provided by Parliament for that purpose.

Provided that it shall not be necessary to lay before either House of Parliament plans and specifications of any such construction works and improvements, nor the report of the Engineer-in-Chief thereon, as provided in Section Two of the said Act; but before any part of the said sum of Six hundred Pounds shall be advanced to the Board, plans and specifications of the proposed works shall be submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council.

Poll to be taken before moneys borrowed.

5 The Board of the Town of Queenborough shall not proceed in the matter of borrowing any sum of money under the authority of this Act until and after a poll has been taken of the Electors of the Town of Queenborough for the purpose of ascertaining whether the Board shall be permitted to proceed in the matter of borrowing such moneys. If at the taking of such poll a less number than two-thirds of the votes shall be in favour of the Board proceeding to borrow any sum of money under this Act, the Board shall not proceed to borrow any such money: Provided that, in the event of there not being the necessary number of votes recorded at such poll in favour of the Board borrowing such money, the Board may at any time after the expiration of Three months cause another poll of the Electors to be taken, and if at any such subsequent poll the necessary number of votes is obtained, the Board may proceed to borrow such money.

Method of taking Poll.

6 Every poll of Electors taken under the provisions of this Act shall be taken in the same manner as a poll taken in the Town of Queenborough for the election of Members of the Board, and every Elector shall be entitled to the same number of votes as the number which he is entitled to use at an election of a Member of the Board; and the Ballot-papers to be used in the taking of every such poll shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Act.

Notice of Poll.

- 7 When the said Board shall decide to take a Poll of the Electors as aforesaid, they shall cause an advertisement of such Poll to be inserted not less than Three times in a daily newspaper circulating in the Town of Queenborough, and in Two consecutive numbers of the Gazette, and such advertisement shall contain the following particulars:—
  - 1. The time and place of such Poll.
  - 2. The works proposed to be constructed or performed by the Board.
  - 3. The estimated cost of such works.
