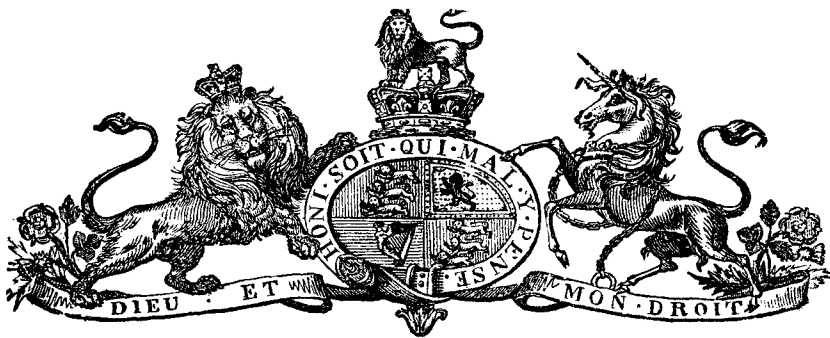

AN ACT to provide for the Establishment and Regulation of Rifle Clubs in Country Districts. [18 September, 1863.]

WHEREAS it is desirable that encouragement should be given to residents in Country Districts to form themselves into Rifle Clubs: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 It shall be lawful for Ten or more persons in any Country District to form themselves into a Rifle Club; and on application to the Governor it shall be lawful for him to direct, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, that the Members of the Club be supplied with Rifles on loan, and Ammunition on payment being made for the same, on conditions and under such Regulations as the Governor in Council may, from time to time, frame for the regulation and control of Rifle Clubs.

Rifle Clubs how formed.

2 The Regulations so framed shall be published in the Government Gazette, and have the full force of law under this Act.

Regulations to be published in the Gazette.

3 This Act shall come into operation on the First day of October next.

Commencement of Act.

4 In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression The Rifle Clubs Act, 1863.
