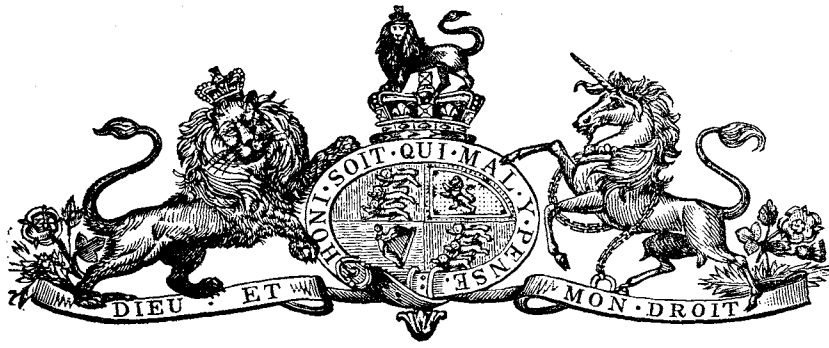

AN ACT to amend “The Church of *Rome* A.D. 1889.  
Trustee Act.” [5 *December*, 1889.] —

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend “The Church of *Rome* PREAMBLE.  
Trustee Act.”

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*,  
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and  
House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** This Act may be cited as “The *Roman* Catholic Church Trustee Short title.  
Amendment Act, 1889.”

**2** The Church in *Tasmania* heretofore known or called by the name Name of Church.  
of “The Church of *Rome*” shall, from and after the passing of this  
Act, be called and known by the name of “The *Roman* Catholic  
Church in *Tasmania*.”

**3** Whenever in any enactment or document the words “Bishop of Archbishop of  
the Church of *Rome*” occur, or any other words intended to designate *Hobart*.  
the chief Ecclesiastical Authority of the said Church, the same shall be  
read and construed as meaning the *Roman* Catholic Archbishop of  
*Hobart*.

**4** The piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto, and Land in Schedule  
conveyed by an Indenture dated the Fourteenth day of *May*, One vested in Church  
thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, registered No.  $\frac{7}{6901}$ , by the Trustees.

Roman Catholic Church Trustee Amendment.

---

A.D. 1889.

*Van Diemen's Land* Company to the late the Right Reverend *Robert William Willson*, D.D., the late the Very Reverend Vicar-General *William Hall*, and the late *Henry Frampton Anstey*, for the purpose of erecting thereon a *Roman Catholic* Chapel and Minister's Residence, is hereby vested in the Trustees for the time being of the property of the *Roman Catholic Church* in *Tasmania*.

Power to Trustees  
to sell, lease, &c.  
said land.

**5** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said Indenture, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of the said piece or parcel of land, or any portion thereof, upon such terms and in such manner as they shall think fit, and to enter into and execute all deeds, leases, mortgages, contracts, documents, and writings necessary for carrying into legal effect any sale, lease, exchange, mortgage, or other disposition of such land or any portion thereof.

Trustees to hold  
money arising  
from sale.

**6** The said Trustees shall apply the moneys arising from any sale of the said piece or parcel of land or any portion thereof in the purchase of another site for the erection of a Church and Minister's Residence chosen by the Priest in charge of the District in which the said land is situate, and the surplus, if any, shall be applied in the erection of a Church on such new site as aforesaid; and any portion of the purchase money of the said land which may remain after the erection of such new Church and a Minister's Residence shall be applied to such purposes and in such manner as the said Archbishop of *Hobart* for the time being may, by instrument under his hand and seal, direct.

Acts to be read  
together.

**7** "The Church of *Rome* Trustee Act," as amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act.

SCHEDULE.

---

All those allotments, pieces, or parcels of land situate in the Township of *Burnie*, at *Emu Bay*, known and distinguished by the numbers 15, 16, 43, and 44 on the Map or Plan of the said Company's estates at *Emu Bay*, in the office of the said Company at *Burnie* aforesaid, and containing one acre or thereabouts, bounded on the north by *Cattley-street*, being a line bearing east five chains, on the east by *Marine Terrace*, being a line bearing south two chains, on the south by allotment No. 14, in the occupation of the *Police*, and No. 42, in the possession of the *Van Diemen's Land* Company, being a line bearing west five chains, and on the west by *Wilson-street*, being a line bearing north two chains, to the point of commencement.
