

AN ACT to enable the Colonial Treasurer to make Advances upon the Security of Special Rates levied under "The Cross and Bye [21 December, 1871.] Roads Act, 1870."

WHEREAS it is expedient to give facilities to Road Trustees to PREAMBLE. procure Loans upon security of any Special Rate made under the 33 Vict. No. 8. authority of "The Cross and Bye Roads Act, 1870:" Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 Whenever it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of the Colonial Trea-Governor in Council that the expenditure of moneys beyond the annual rates made and levied under "The Cross and Bye Roads Act, 1870," of special rates is necessary or desirable for making or improving the Roads in any Road District, and that the Landholders of such District have approved of the expediency of raising a loan and assented to a Special Rate for the reimbursement thereof with interest, it shall be lawful for the Colonial Treasurer, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to advance and lend to the Trustees of such Road District any sum of money which may be lawfully borrowed by the said Trustees sum of money which may be lawfully borrowed by the said Trustees upon the security of such Special Rate to be made under the provisions of the said Act; and all the provisions of the said Act relating to Loans shall be applicable for the purposes of this Act, and shall be incorporated herewith.

# Roads Loans Act.

Rate of interest on money lent.

2 Any sum of money advanced and lent by the Colonial Treasurer under this Act shall bear interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum, payable yearly.

Mortgage in name of Colonial Treasurer.

3 Every more made under the said Act for the purposes of such Loan shall be taken in the name of the Colonial Treasurer for the time being; and all powers conferred by the said Act upon mortgagees may be exercised by the Colonial Treasurer for the time being.

Short Title.

4 This Act may be cited as "The Roads Loans Act."
