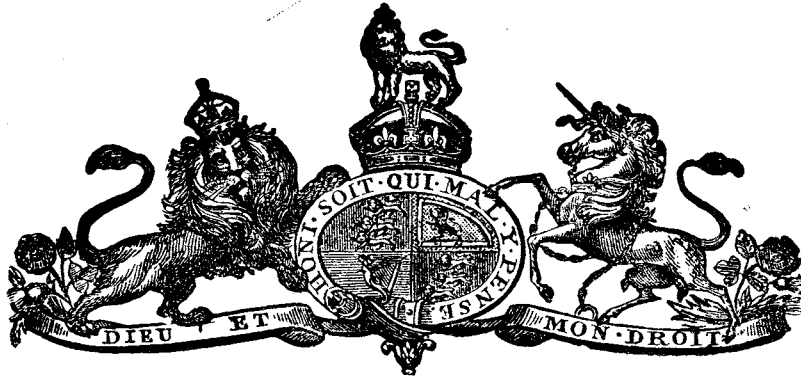

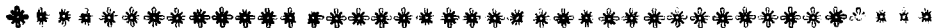

AN ACT to amend the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1895. [17 September, 1926.]

A.D. 1926

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1926.” Short title.

2 Section Thirty-seven of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1895, is hereby repealed, and the following new Section Thirty-seven substituted therefor:— Repeal of Section 37 of 59 Vict. No. 9 and substitution of new section.

“37—(1) The Registrar-General and all other registrars shall cause indexes to be made of all entries in the register books in their respective offices, and shall keep the same with the other records in such offices. Searches.

(2) Any person shall be entitled, at any time when the office of any such Registrar is required to be open, and upon payment of the appropriate fee, to have a search made in any such index or register book in such office, and, upon production of essential information, to have a copy of any entry or entries therein certified under the hand of the Registrar-General or registrar, as the case may be.

(3) The fees payable in respect of searches and certificates under this section shall be—

- i. Particular search of index or register book only, including uncertified extract, Two Shillings.
- ii. General search of index or register books, not exceeding One hour, including uncertified extract, Five Shillings; for every additional hour or part of an hour, One Shilling and Sixpence :
- iii. Certificate, without seal, with particular search, but not including general search. Five Shillings :
- iv. Certificate, with seal, with particular search, but not including general search, Seven Shillings and Sixpence."
