AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of 1910.

Crown Lands, and for other purposes.

[13 January, 1911.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1 This Act may be cited as "The Reinstatement of Crown Lands Short title. Purchasers Act, 1910."
- 2—(1.) The Governor may permit any purchaser of any One or Governor may more allotments of rural land purchased under any past, present, or permit selectors future Act regulating the sale and disposal of the lands of the Crown to complete to complete the purchase of any allotment, or any One portion of an allotment, upon the following conditions:—

1. That the purchaser is unable to complete the contract entered into for the purchase of the whole of the said land:

A.D. 1910.

- II. That substantial improvements have been effected upon the land purchased to the value of One Pound for every acre of the land to be retained by the purchaser
- III. That the purchaser pays the expense of surveying the land to be retained by him.

The allotment or portion of the land to be retained shall be selected in accordance with the regulations for the time being in force under any Act regulating the sale and disposal of the lands of the Crown.

Purchase-money to be applied in or towards payment for portion of land selected. (2.) In any case in which any purchaser is permitted to avail himself of the provisions of this section, the Commissioner shall apply Three-fourths of the full amount of the purchase-money paid by such purchaser upon all the land contracted to be purchased in or towards the payment of the purchase-money payable in respect of the allotment or portion of such land which such purchaser is permitted to complete the purchase of.

Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers. Schedule (1.). 3 The Commissioner of Crown Lands may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in Schedule (1.) as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of such lots or areas were respectively made; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments upon such lands at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided in Section Ninetysix or Ninety-seven, as the case may be, of "The Crown Lands Act, 1903," together with interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the date when such instalments became due.

Certain persons named in Schedule (2.) to be permitted to complete their purchases. 4 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Crown Lands Act, 1890," "The Crown Lands Act, 1903," or "The Crown Lands Act, 1905," it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to permit the persons named in Schedule (2.) to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said lands to the said persons respectively, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

Commissioner may sell land to Edward Emmet Symons. Schedule (3.).

5 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to sell by private contract to Edward Emmet Symons the surface of the lot of Crown land described in Schedule (3.) for the sum of Eight Pounds Ten Shillings, subject to the provisions of Part V. of "The Crown Lands Act, 1903."

Power to convey certain land to John Anderson Fawns. Schedule (4.).

6 In consideration of John Anderson Fawns having conveyed to the Crown certain lands for road purposes, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to

convey and alienate the Crown land as described in Schedule (4.) to A.D. 1910. the said John Anderson Fawns, in fee simple, or for any less estate or
