

ANALYSIS.

1. Short title.

2. Certain persons whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers.

3. Certain persons named in Schedule (2) to be permitted to complete their purchases.

4. Existing leases of Wynyard Showground may be cancelled by the Governor, who may convey the land leased to persons nominated by the committee of Table Cape Agricultural and Pastoral Society with power to sell and apply proceeds in purchase of a more suitable showground, &c.

5. Power to convey certain land to H.

Jones & Company Ltd.

6. Commissioner may lease Clarke Island by private contract.

AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of 1919. certain Persons as Purchasers of certain Crown Lands, and for other purposes [24 *December*, 1919.]

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of

Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:— 1 This Act may be cited as "The Reinstatement of Crown Lands Short title. Purchasers' Act, 1919."

respectively made; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments upon such lands at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided in Section Ninety-2 Geo. V. No. 64. six of "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," together with interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the date when such instalments became due.

Certain persons named in Schedule (2) to be permitted to complete their purchases.

3 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any repealed or existing Act regulating the sale or disposition of lands of the Crown, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Crown Lands to permit the persons named in Schedule (2) hereto to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Fifteen Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King to convey and alienate the said lands to the said persons respectively, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

Existing leases of Wynyard Showground may be cancelled by the Governor, who may convey the land leased to persons nominated by the Committee of Table Cape Agricultural and Pastoral Society with power to sell and apply proceeds in purchase of a more suitable show-ground, &c. Schedules (3), (4), (5), and (6).

4—(1) It shall be lawful for the Governor, at the request of the Committee of the Table Cape Agricultural and Pastoral Society (hereinafter referred to as the said Society) by Proclamation, to cancel the existing leases of the allotments of Crown land described in Schedules (3, (4), and (5) to this Act (constituting the said Society's showground at Wynyard), and thereupon such leases shall be deemed to have been duly surrendered to His Majesty the King and shall be handed to the Minister for Lands.

(2) After the publication of such Proclamation it shall be lawful for the Governor in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, at the request of the said Committee, to convey and alienate the said allotments of land by the description thereof contained in Schedule (6) to this Act, to such persons as such Committee may nominate for the purpose, in fee simple.

(3) The persons in whom the said land shall be so vested—

1. Shall, subject to Paragraph 11. hereof, hold the same for the proper purposes of the said society until the Committee thereof shall have secured a more suitable show-ground:

11. May, with the consent of such Committee, sell the said land to the best advantage in lots or otherwise, by public auction or private contract, at such price and subject to such conditions as to payment or otherwise as such Committee may approve:

III. May upon any sale being made execute a conveyance or transfer of the land sold to the purchaser, and receive the

purchase money on behalf of the said Committee:

iv. Shall, with the approval of the said Committe, apply any moneys so received in or towards payment for any new show-ground or in or towards the fencing of such new ground or erecting buildings thereon or making improvements thereto.

- (4) The transfer or conveyance of such new ground shall be taken A.D. 1919 in the names of the persons who are then members of the said Committee, and they shall hold the land for the purposes of a show-ground for the said society.
- 5 In consideration of John Hay having surrendered to His Majesty Power to convey the King Two acres of land at Leprena for a school site, it shall be certain land to lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the land described in Schedule (7). hereto, at the request of the said John Hay, to H. Jones & Company Limited, in fee simple, or for any less estate or interest.

6-(1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Commissioner Crown Lands Act, 1911," it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of may lease Clarke Crown Lands to lease Clarke Island by private contract for a term not Island by private exceeding Seven years from the First day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, to G. S. Maclaine, John D. Maclaine, and Archibald A. Maclaine as co-partners at a yearly rental of Three hundred and fifty Pounds.

(2) The lease for such island shall be subject to the provisions of "The Crown Lands Act, 1911," applicable to leases for grazing purposes, and any regulations made thereunder with regard to leasing Crown lands for grazing purposes.
