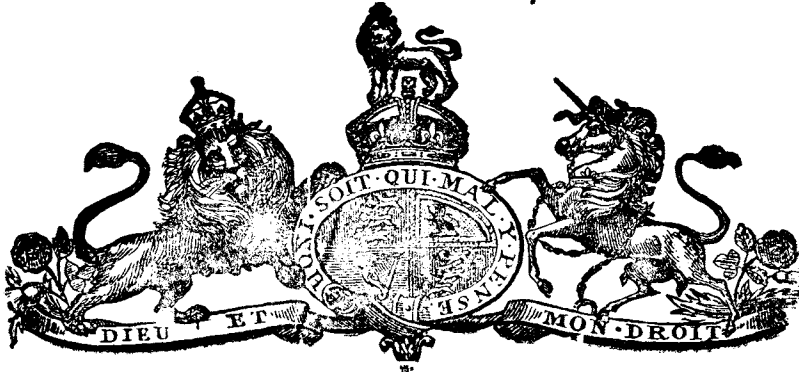

AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of certain Persons as Purchasers of certain Crown Lands, and to authorise the Governor to alienate certain Crown Lands. A.D. 1929.

[18 *January*, 1930.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as “The Reinstatement of Crown Lands Purchasers Act, 1929.” Short title.

(2) The Crown Lands Act, 1911, is hereby incorporated with this Act. Incorporation of 2 Geo. V. No. 64.

3 The Commissioner, with the consent of the Governor, may reinstate the persons named in Schedule (1) as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of such lots or areas were made respectively; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments due upon such lands at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided in Section Ninety-six of the Crown Lands Act, 1911, together with interest at the rate of Five Pounds per centum per annum from the dates when such instalments became due respectively.

4 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any repealed or existing Act regulating the sale or disposition of lands of the Crown, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to permit the persons named in Schedule (2) to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Twenty Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to convey and alienate the said lands to the said persons respectively, in fee simple.

5 It shall be lawful for the Commissioner to sell by private contract to *Frank Coad* the Crown land described in Schedule (3) for the sum of Thirty Pounds, and, upon payment of the said sum into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of Twenty Shillings, the Governor is hereby authorised, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, to convey and alienate the said land to the said *Frank Coad*, in fee simple.

6 Upon *John Frederick Johnson* surrendering to the Crown the land described in Schedule (4), it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, to convey and alienate the land described in Schedule (5) to the said *John Frederick Johnson*, in fee simple.

Bounded on the north by 8 chains 4 links easterly along Lot 1 Section H purchased by Thomas Mills commencing at the west angle thereof on Henry-street on the south-east by 9 chains 85 links south-westerly along Lots 2 and 5 purchased by Thomas Mills and Walter Thomas Cross respectively on the south by 8 chains westerly along Charles-street and thence on the north-west by 9 chains 83 links north-easterly along Henry-street aforesaid to the point of commencement.
